**Details of value of contract for “Development Partner” to the Home Office Identity Cards Programme**

- The contract was let by competitive tender under the Office of Government Commerce framework arrangement “S-CAT” (details of which can be found at [www.s-cat.gov.uk](http://www.s-cat.gov.uk)) which is compliant with Public Sector procurement regulations and offers value for money to public sector purchasers.
- The nature of the contract for this service is such that a definitive “fixed price” value cannot be produced and packages of work are agreed monthly, in line with rates quoted as part of the overall tender for the work.
- As such the Home Office has made no firm commitment to any contract value and procedures are in place to ensure best value is achieved.
- The committed spend on this contract as at end March 2005 was £8,341,608.
- Although the total value of the contract will not be known until the contract is concluded, the tender price given in the successful tender (which are only *estimates* - due to the nature of the arrangement) were £9.87 million for the development phase of the programme (to approximately March 2005) and £8.87 million for the procurement phase.

#### **Details of value of contract for legal support to the Home Office Identity Cards Programme**

- The contract was let by competitive tender under the Office of Government Commerce framework arrangement “L-CAT” (details of which can be found at <http://www.ogcbs.gov.uk/LCat/1437335.asp>) which is compliant with Public Sector procurement regulations and offers value for money to public sector purchasers.
- The nature of the contract for this service is such that a definitive “fixed price” value cannot be produced and packages of work are agreed monthly, in line with rates quoted as part of the overall tender for the work.
- As such the Home Office has made no firm commitment to any contract value and procedures are in place to ensure best value is achieved.
- The committed spend on this contract as at end March 2005 was £309,145.90.
- Although the total value of the contract will not be known until the contract is concluded, the tender price given in the successful tender (which was only an *estimate* - due to the nature of the arrangement) for initial identified packages of work was £129,884.55.

#### **Details of value of contract for support from Office of Government Commerce (OGC) and Partnerships UK to the Home Office Identity Cards Programme**

- The nature of the contracts for this service is such that a definitive “fixed price” value cannot be produced and work is agreed on an “as needed” basis, in line with agreed rates.
- As such the Home Office has made no firm commitment to any contract value and procedures are in place to ensure best value is achieved.
- The committed spend on this contract as at end March 2005 was £12,268.53 and £23,755 respectively.
