

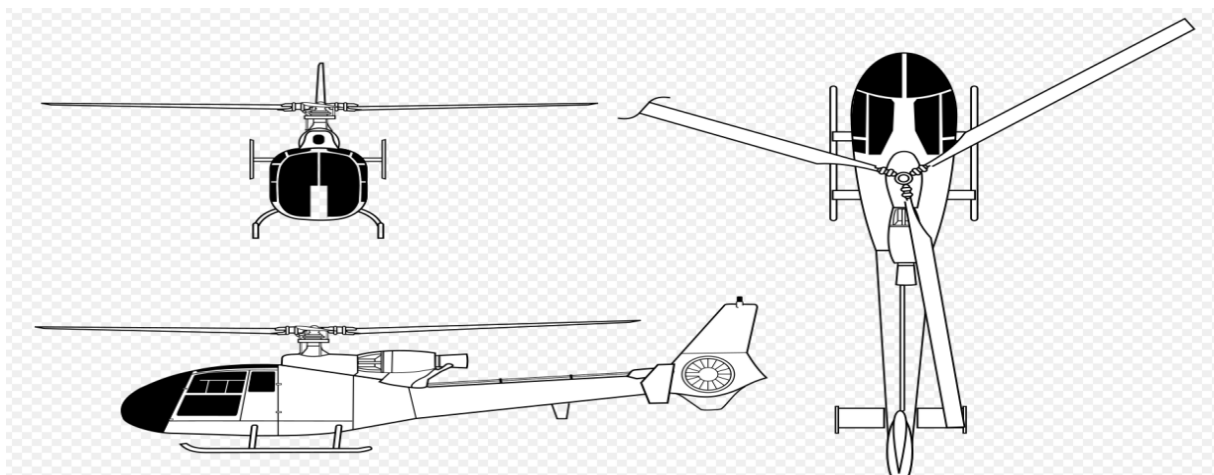


Key features:

- Five seat helicopter used for light transport, training and light attack duties
- Minimal maintenance and low running costs

The Gazelle is used by approximately 23 countries, primarily for surveillance and reconnaissance. It is also used in applications such as attack, anti-tank, anti-helicopter, transport and training. Advantages include its small agile nature with lightweight chassis and its unparalleled visibility from the cockpit. While many helicopters struggled with the extreme conditions of the Afghan and Iraqi theatres, the Gazelle was the best performing model amongst British aircraft. It can accommodate 1 pilot and 4 passengers and up to 600kg of cargo on the underside cargo hook.
