Testing for COVID-19



COVID-19 is a new illness that has spread around the world.



Some people can feel very ill when they have COVID-19.

Other people might not feel ill at all.



You can do this test even if you do not feel ill.

You can do the test and check the results yourself.



It will take about 15 minutes to do the test.

Then you wait for 15 minutes to get your results.



Warning

Do not read results after 30 minutes.



You should tell the NHS what your test results are.

Important Only use one test kit at a time.

What is in your test kit

The test kit has everything you need to do your test. Your box has 7 test kits in it. Every test kit has:



- A swab in a packet. The swab is a stick with a bud at 1 end.
- 2 A plastic tube. It will have some liquid at the bottom.
- 3 A plastic test cassette in a packet



A box with a small round hole. This is to hold the plastic tube while you do your test.



5 A small bag. You can use this bag to put rubbish from your test in.

Do not use a test if anything is ripped, broken or missing. Use another test.

About the test

The test is nothing to worry about. It will be quick and it will not hurt.



You will take the sample from your nose using the swab.

You will use the same swab for both of your nostrils.



If your nostril is pierced you must take your jewellery out before doing the test.

Getting ready to do your test



Clean and dry a flat surface. Then unpack everything from the test kit onto it.



Now wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser.



Pull the lid off the plastic tube.

Then put the plastic tube in the tube holder.



Warning

Make sure the liquid does not touch your skin.

The liquid in the tube is important for the test. Be careful not to spill or touch any of it.

If the liquid gets on your skin or in your eyes, wash with lots of water.

See a doctor if your skin or eyes keep hurting.



Open the swab packet and gently take out the swab.

Hold the swab at the stick end.



Warning

Do not touch the soft, fabric tip of the swab.

Test a child or someone else

Children under 12 should be tested by an adult.



Warning

Do not do the test if you're not sure what you're doing.

Show the child the test kit. Tell them what you're going to do.

It's helpful if the child sits on someone's lap.

Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser.

Doing a test on someone else

Children under 12 should be tested by an adult.



Place the fabric tip of the swab just inside one nostril of the child or person you are testing until you feel some resistance.

Gently rotate the swab around the inside of their nostril in a circular motion 5 times.

Now put the same swab up the other nostril put the swab up your other nostril less than 2.5cm from the edge of the nostril.

Gently rotate the swab around the inside of their other nostril in a circular motion 5 times.

Warning

Stop the test if the child is hurting.

Swabbing your nose



Test yourself

Put the swab into your nostril and push it gently upwards less than 2.5cm from the edge of the nostril. Do not insert any deeper if you feel strong resistance or pain.

Gently rotate the swab round 5 times in your nostril.

This may make your eyes water or you may sneeze. This is OK.

Now put the same swab up your other nostril in the same way.

Gently rotate the swab around the inside of your other nostril in a circular motion 5 times.



Warning

Do not swab your nostril if you have a nosebleed. Wait until your nose stops bleeding. Start again using a new test kit.

After swabbing your nose



Put the swab into the plastic tube. The bud should go in the liquid.

Make sure the liquid stays in the tube.



Stir the liquid with the swab for 30 seconds.

For best performance, put the swab in the plastic tube as soon as possible after swabbing the nostrils.



Rotate the swab 5 times while squeezing the bottom of the plastic tube.



When you are taking the swab out, pinch the plastic tube to squeeze the rest of the liquid out.

Put the swab in the plastic bag.



Push the dropper tip onto the plastic tube. Make sure it is on tightly so no liquid can spill.



Put the tube back into the holder to keep it still.

Using your test cassette



Open the test cassette packet and take out the test cassette.

Important

Once opened, start the test within 30 minutes.



Your test cassette looks like this:

This part will tell you your results.

It has the letters C and T next to it.

This part is for you to put your swab sample on. This is a small dip in the cassette. It has the letter S next to it.



Important

Place the cassette on a flat and level surface. Do not move the test cassette during the test.



Make sure your test cassette is on a clean and flat surface.

Slowly squeeze 4 drops of liquid from your plastic tube into the dip next to the letter S.

Make sure there is no air bubble.

Put the plastic tube in the bag provided.



Set the timer and leave your test cassette for 15 minutes before you read the result.

You can read the result between 15 to 30 minutes but do not read after 30 minutes.

Getting your test results



Look at your test cassette after 15 minutes.



Warning Do not read results after 30 minutes.

Your test should show a line next to the letter C. This shows that your test is working.



If your test is just showing 1 line next to the letter C, you probably do not have COVID-19. We call this a negative result.



If your test shows 2 lines next to the letters C and T, you probably have COVID-19.

We call this a positive result.



If you test positive you should:

Follow advice on staying at home and avoiding contact with other people: <u>nhs.uk/stay-at-home</u>



If you have no lines or just a line by the letter T, the test did not work.



If this happens you should do the test again.

You must use a new test kit.

Telling the NHS about your results

You should tell the NHS the results of your test, even if it did not work. You can do this:

The test cassette has a code on it. You need this number when you tell the NHS about your results.

That's it, well done.



Any rubbish from your test kit can go in the plastic bag. Then put this in your bin.

Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser.
