Interventions, Outputs and Outcomes

To access their allocation, each place across the UK, will be asked to develop a UKSPF plan that addresses three questions:

- Local context
- Selection of outcomes and interventions
- Delivery

In their plans, places will select outputs and outcomes relevant to each UKSPF investment priority. Places will set out measurable outcomes that reflect local needs and opportunities. These should inform the interventions they wish to deliver.

Each place, and each intervention across the UK must use common indicators, as set out for each intervention to measure outputs, outcomes and impacts. This ensures that we can compare similar interventions in different places and undertake and synthesise evaluation activities. It also means that places will be able to work together more easily, and organisations delivering in multiple places will be able to deliver their interventions more efficiently.

The types of interventions that will be delivered against will be set out in further detail in the Northern Ireland investment plan, the UK Government will work directly with partners and stakeholders across Northern Ireland on this plan over the summer. This group could include representatives from Northern Ireland Executive Departments, local authorities, businesses and the voluntary sector. This will forge new ways of working and opportunities across Northern Ireland.

Final indicator definitions will be confirmed in the summer, prior to the submission date of the investment plans, when further guidance will be published on GOV.UK.
