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# Overview of the Restoring Your Railway Fund

In January 2020, the Government pledged £500million for the Restoring Your Railway (RYR) Fund, to deliver on its manifesto commitment and start reopening lines and stations as part of the levelling-up agenda.

Two years on, this update provides an overview of all the schemes in the programme, their progress, and the approaches being taken to develop rail schemes and reconnect communities. It includes all the schemes funded through Restoring Your Railway, including the 9 schemes announced as receiving further funding in June 2022. Schemes are listed by their stage in the programme as follows – Schemes Developing to SOBC; Schemes Progressing Past SOBC; Schemes Being Delivered; Schemes Not Progressing to Delivery Under RYR; Unsuccessful Bids to the Ideas Fund ([Appendix B](#)).

More than 50 years since the railways were radically reshaped during the infamous Beeching cuts of the 1960s, when thousands of miles of both track and stations were closed, Restoring Your Railway is kick-starting and boosting development on projects that have the potential to reinvigorate local economies and level up opportunity across the country. Towns and communities across England and Wales, left isolated when their railways were closed, are closer to having their connections restored, improving access to jobs, homes, and education.

## Innovative approaches

Projects supported through the fund are using innovative approaches to drive down the cost and time taken to deliver rail enhancements through initiatives such as Better Value Rail (BVR) and Rail SPEED. BVR checks that the right projects are started, whilst Rail SPEED promotes efficiency through identifying cost and schedule saving opportunities. These two initiatives are complementary to make sure rail infrastructure is delivered as efficiently as possible whilst addressing any possible issues early on.

Better Value Rail is a set of tools hosted on the [www.BetterValueRail.uk](http://www.BetterValueRail.uk) site which helps people make good decisions and ask the right questions early on in potential rail projects. It helps people across the industry to turn good ideas into great schemes, and take forward the right solution (which may not necessarily be rail).

Rail SPEED (Swift, Pragmatic and Efficient Enhancement Delivery) was jointly developed by the Department for Transport and Network Rail in early 2020 and has an ambitious vision to 'significantly reduce the time and cost' of delivering improvements to the railway, safely.

Rail SPEED has developed cross-cutting themes to make project delivery quicker, with this innovative way of working and simplification of processes being rolled out across all rail upgrades.

The delivery of the Dartmoor Line, a SPEED project, has been accelerated by almost two years against its original project schedule, with a 'one team culture' developed between the Department for Transport, Network Rail and Great Western Railway.

### **The Restoring Your Railway Fund**

The Department for Transport (DfT) invited MPs, local councils and community groups across England and Wales to propose how they could use funding to reinstate axed local services and restore closed stations.

Funding was split into three categories to support projects at different phases of development. The categories are:

- The Ideas Fund – which provides development funding for early-stage ideas to explore options to restore lost rail connections to communities.
- Advanced Proposals – supporting lines and stations already being considered for restoration and those submitted to the fund that were beyond early development.
- The New Stations Fund (Round 3) – support for proposals for new stations and the restoration of old station sites.

### **The Ideas Fund**

Through the Ideas Fund, we are supporting the development of projects to restore lost rail connections to communities.

DfT is funding 75% of costs, up to a maximum contribution of £50,000, to help successful projects carry out transport and economic studies to create a business case. Future funding to develop projects is subject to the strength of the business case.

Applications to the Ideas Fund were sponsored by one or more Members of Parliament whose constituencies would benefit from the scheme, and promoted by a variety of groups that included:

- local government
- community groups
- heritage railways
- local enterprise partnerships

Across three Ideas Fund rounds, 141 unique bids were received, with some schemes re-submitted to multiple rounds following feedback. A total of 199 bids were received, including re-bids.

- The first round accepted bids from January to March 2020. 59 bids were received. The 10 successful bids were announced in May 2020.
- The second round accepted bids from April to June 2020. 51 bids were received. The 15 successful bids were announced in November 2020 in the National Infrastructure Strategy.
- The third round accepted bids from January to March 2021. 89 bids were received. The 13 successful bids were announced in October 2021 in the Budget.

Recommendations for decisions for funding were made by the Ideas Fund expert panel, which was comprised of:

- The Rt Hon Chris Heaton-Harris MP – then Rail Minister, DfT (Chair)
- The Rt Hon Simon Clarke MP (rounds 1 and 2) – then Minister for Regional Growth and Local Government, Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG)
- Luke Hall MP (round 3) – then Minister for Regional Growth and Local Government, MHCLG
- Sir Peter Hendy – Chair, Network Rail
- Jackie Sadek – Chief Operating Officer, UK Regeneration
- Isabel Dedring – former Deputy Mayor of London for Transport

The assessment of Ideas Fund bids focussed on identifying schemes that would bring significant socio-economic benefits and had a clear narrative around the proposed services and infrastructure requirements. The strongest schemes made a clear case for how they would reconnect and level up communities.

The Ideas Fund is supporting successful proposals to conduct feasibility studies and reach the Strategic Outline Business Case stage of project development. The focus of this stage is to define the transport problem, set out the objectives of the scheme, and explore the options for intervention.

As part of producing a Strategic Outline Business Case, promoters have been advised to consider the costs, benefits, disbenefits, and value for money of their schemes. They have also been asked to consider whether another transport mode, for instance bus, or light rail, would better meet their community's needs.

Department for Transport and Network Rail teams work closely with scheme promoters to develop the business case and provide ongoing guidance to promoters, ensuring they make the best case possible.

Business cases submitted to the Department are assessed and decisions are taken by ministers on which to develop further. In total, nine Ideas Fund schemes have now been granted funding to carry out further development work.

The Ideas Fund is also supporting development in the East Midlands through expansion of the Network Rail Lincolnshire Rail Study, including exploration of the potential to reinstate the Firsby to Louth Line, with links to a new station at Mablethorpe.

### **Advanced Proposals**

Funding has also been made available to accelerate the development and delivery of schemes with strong existing business cases and other schemes that already have supporting analysis and are seeking a larger sum to progress further.

Two of the schemes in this category, the Dartmoor Line, and the Northumberland Line, are the most advanced schemes in the programme.

On 20 November 2021, the Dartmoor Line between Okehampton and Exeter officially reopened for year-round services for the first time in nearly 50 years, marking the first restoration under the programme. This was made possible thanks to over £40 million of Restoring Your Railway investment.

The route connects Exeter, Crediton and Okehampton, providing a launchpad for visitors to explore Dartmoor and regional links for local commuters. The reopening of the route is expected to boost local businesses, the tourism sector, and provide greater access to education and work for thousands of people who live locally.

The line was transformed from a mothballed former freight railway with occasional summer Sunday services to a full 7 days a week passenger operation in a mere 9 months following confirmation of funding, coming in more than £10 million under budget. Services on the Dartmoor Line were increased from two-hourly to hourly from 15 May 2022. This followed further infrastructure work that has also delivered an improved journey time of around 35 minutes between Okehampton and Exeter St Davids. All daytime services now start and end at Exeter Central, providing closer access to the city centre.

In January 2021, £34m of funding was announced to progress plans to reopen the Northumberland line to passenger services between Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Ashington operating 2 trains per hour, with six new stations, including two serving the Blyth area and one connecting to the Newcastle Metro service by the end of 2023.

This funding has allowed preparatory works to begin - including land acquisition, detailed design work and early site works. Restoring services along the line would improve connectivity between deprived communities in south east Northumberland

and job opportunities in Tyne and Wear. A Full Business Case was received from Northumberland County Council in November 2021 and is being reviewed through the agreed governance process.

Other high potential schemes funded through the Advanced Proposals category are being supported to reach the next appropriate stage of rail project development, through the usual process for rail enhancements within England and Wales.

### **The New Stations Fund**

The third part of Restoring Your Railway is the New Stations Fund (NSF).

The NSF is an open competition and calls for bids from Local Authorities and other interested third parties. The fund has the aim of opening new and restored stations across England and Wales that reconnect communities, contributing to local economic regeneration and improving access to jobs, homes and education and supporting greener travel choices. The programme aims link closely to those of the Government's levelling up and Build Back Better agenda.

The NSF began in 2014 and invested £40 million over two rounds for the delivery of ten stations across England and Wales. It provides up to 75% of the cost of building new stations at option selection and above and helps to give local communities improved access to rail. The NSF has already delivered eight new stations across England and Wales. The final two stations from the second round of the NSF, Reading Green Park and Portway Parkway, are due to be completed by the end of this year.

As part of the November 2020 Spending Review, £32m was announced for NSF3 (part of the overall Restoring your Railway funding package) to be used to part-fund six new stations for full delivery and progress two stations to the development stage, all to be completed by March 2024.



# Schemes Developing to SOBC

A Strategic Outline Business Case (SOBC) is one of the earliest stages in considering a transport intervention. The focus of this stage is to define the transport problem, set out the objectives of the scheme, and explore the options for intervention.

# Schemes Being Delivered

The most developed schemes in the programme are progressing at pace to reconnect communities as soon as possible. One, the Dartmoor Line, is already providing a restored 7 days a week passenger service, giving passengers the chance to choose rail over the road and travel from Exeter to Okehampton on greener, cleaner modes of transport.

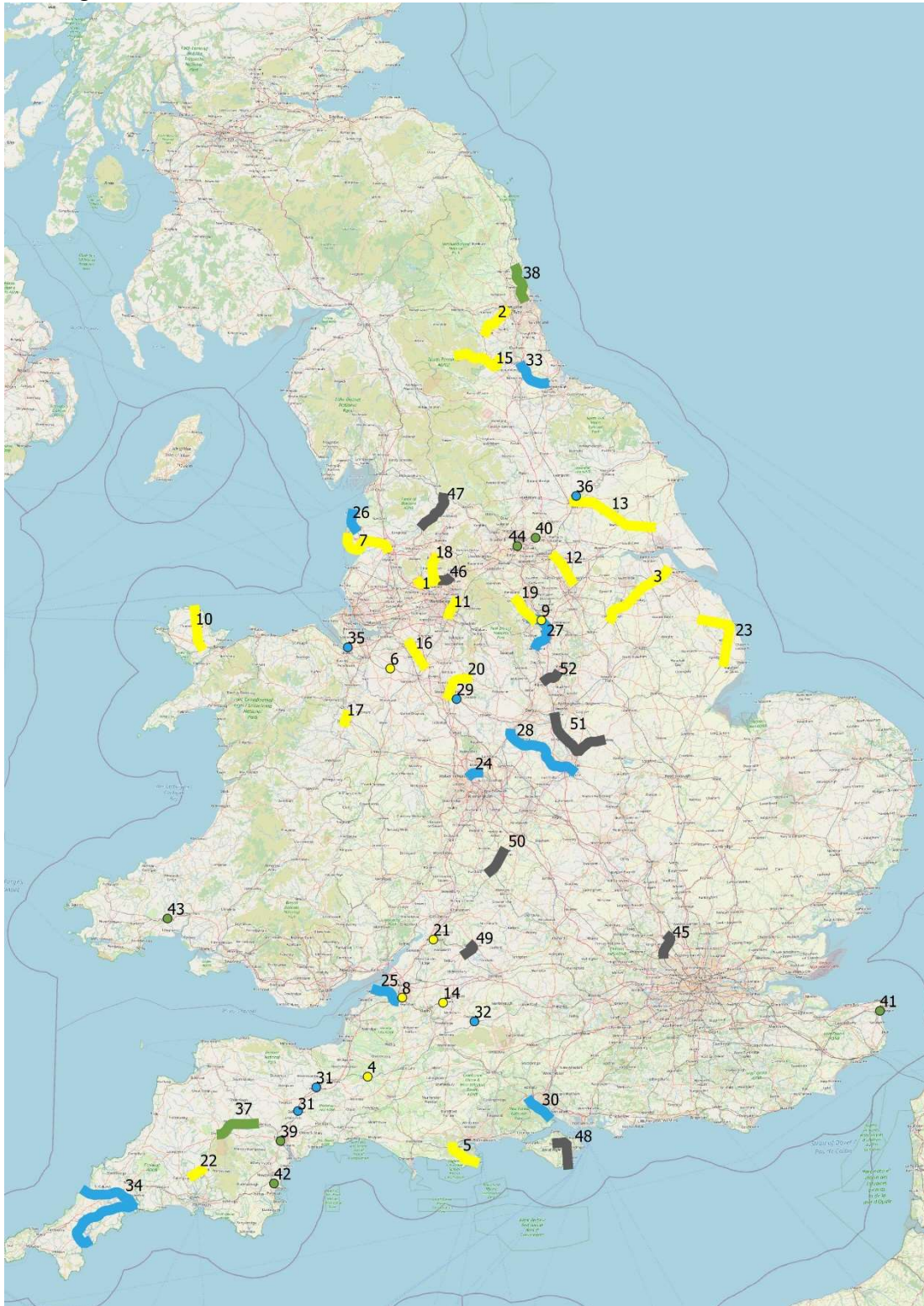

# Appendix B: Schemes not progressing to delivery under RYR

Not all schemes supported as part of Restoring Your Railway will proceed to delivery. In some cases, obstacles will have been identified to further development. In others, given limited funding, they may not have been assessed as the priority schemes to proceed at this time. For some schemes, other routes for further progression have been identified and shared with promoters.

Funding schemes to develop an SOBC through the Ideas Fund is valuable, even if the scheme does not progress to delivery now. The process of developing a business case deepens the understanding of both the transport problem and possible interventions to address it, supporting communities to improve their transport links effectively and efficiently. Detailed feedback is provided to every scheme that submits an SOBC through the Ideas Fund, including recommended next steps and potential alternative routes for consideration as appropriate.
