are the criminal justice system.


Many people say or write CJS when they mean the criminal justice system.


#### Because CJS is:

We say CJS in this report.



















#### **Neurodiversity**

Neuro means about the brain.


Diversity is about difference.

Neurodivergent people may:

- Be autistic.
- Have learning difficulties or disabilities.
- Have Attention Deficit Hyperactivity
  Disorder ADHD.
- Have speech and language difficulties.
- Have tic disorders.
- Have brain injuries.

#### Qualifications and Accreditation

These show you have passed a test and know about something.



#### **Community Sentence**

A judge can give people a community sentence instead of sending them to prison.

A community sentence can say that people must get help with something that could make them more likely to get into trouble.

#### The Home Office

Part of their job is to cut crime and the harm crime does.

They lead the work on courts, prison and probation.

They look after courts and tribunals.

They help local police forces work together.

## The Department for Health and Social Care

They lead plans for health and social care.

They look after the NHS in England.

#### The Sentencing Council

They write guides for judges and others.

These guidelines tell people what should happen to someone who has carried out a crime.


#### NHS England and NHS Improvement

#### What is this report about?


In 2021 there was a big report.

## 1. Working together


#### action plan

The Government agreed that working together is important.




It might be best for the needs of neurodivergent people to go into the plans we already have.


#### Here's what has happened already




The police have started training their officers. They have started to make custody safer for neurodivergent people.



The Ministry of Justice is working with Revolving Doors, a charity that works with people with lived experience of the CJS. They will make sure neurodivergent people have a say in what happens.



Lots of people who make big plans in the CJS have got together. They will help to decide if a big plan just about neurodiversity is needed.



Some good things have happened already. Things like:

New guidelines for judges.






The big groups and teams and police will work together to find out if a big plan just about neurodiversity is needed.

### 2. Screening




#### The report said:

We need 1 way to screen people in the CJS to find out if they are neurodivergent.


#### share information

## The National Police Chief's Council are working to share information with the courts.



#### 3. Counting






We need to count how many neurodivergent people use the CJS.



This will help us to plan support for the people who need it.




The Government agreed that counting people would help good planning.

#### prisoner record




 In 4 prisons, information about neurodivergence is being put on prisoners' main records. This will help everyone to understand their needs.

## 4. Training

#### The report said:

People who work in the CJS need the right skills and knowledge. Neurodivergent people should help with this.



**The Government** agreed that staff need the right skills and knowledge. They wanted to know more about what was happening already.

#### Here's what has happened already




For people who write big plans or make the rules there has been:

**The Ministry of Justice** will write a Neurodiversity Training Toolkit.




This will be ready by the end of 2022.

#### The report said:

The CJS needs to make changes to support neurodivergent people well.


The Government agreed changes are important.

It also knows that some buildings are hard to change.

#### Here's what has happened already


- All prisoners have a health check in their first week.
- Some prisons have special wings for neurodivergent prisoners. A wing is a group of prison cells.
- New prisons will be built in a way that is better for neurodivergent prisoners.
- 4 prisons will have Neurodiversity Support staff.
















There are Autism Accreditations for prisons.

These are like qualifications.

They show a prison can support autistic people well.

The Ministry of Justice want more prisons to be accredited.

They have done things like:

 Made things better for prisoners when they arrive.

• Run training for staff.

 Found champions to help neurodivergent people use prison services.



This person is working on a plan. This plan should make things better for neurodivergent people.

They will say what they are doing in November 2022.

In 2020 the **Sentencing Council** gave guidelines on sentencing neurodivergent people.



#### 6. Working together





#### The report said:

CJS, local services and charities should work together to make sure neurodivergent people get the support they need.

This support should stop people getting into trouble in the first place.

If people do get into trouble, support should help them stay out of trouble in the future.

The Government agreed.




Leaders meet every 3 months.

They are looking at what needs to be done.




They will say what they have found in November 2022.
