
How to apply

Introduction



In 2022, the government made a new law, called 'The British Sign Language (BSL) Act'.



This law says that:

 British Sign Language (BSL) is a language that people in the UK use.



The government needs to make sure information it gives to the public is available in British Sign Language.





To help us follow the new law, we are making a new group of people who use British Sign Language called the BSL Advisory Board.

This information explains how to apply to be part of the BSL Advisory Board.



You need to apply by 5pm on Friday 2 September 2022.



We will follow the law around keeping your information safe and private.

A **supporting statement** is part of the form where you can talk about yourself and why you are right for this role.

You can apply using only BSL.

Send a video of yourself to apply. Please include:



• Your full name.

• Your address.

- Your email address.
- Any telephone numbers. Please tell us if they are text or video relay.
- Your job.

• Who you work for.

• What you do in your job.

 Someone who signs BSL as your first language?


• A Child Of a Deaf Adult (CODA)?





 A parent of a D/deaf BSL using child or young person?

D/deaf means the person is either Deaf with a capital d, or **deaf** with a small d. The two are different.







Deaf people have been unable to hear all their lives and use sign language.

deaf means someone who finds it hard to hear.

 Someone who works as an interpreter?

An **interpreter** is a hearing person who signs things that people say.

 Someone who works as a translator?

A **translator** is a person who supports BSL signers by signing things that are written down.

 A teacher of D/deaf children who use BSL?



 Someone who uses, or has used tactile or hands-on BSL?

Tactile or hands-on BSL is a type of BSL used to talk to people who are D/deaf and blind. You can use it by touching and feeling parts of people's hands.



 Any Deaf organisations you work with.



• Any work you have done on **committees**.

A **committee** is a group of people chosen by an organisation to work on a project.



Then please send us a supporting statement.



Your supporting statement should not be longer than 5 minutes.



You can send this as 1 video or 2 videos.


What will happen next

A group of people will look at what you send us. The group will include:

- Civil servants these are people who work for the government.
- People who use BSL.
- Someone who doesn't work for the government.



We may ask you to come to an interview. This is a meeting where we talk to you and find out more about if you are right for the role. If we choose you for the role, we will ask you to:



- Write a letter saying you accept it.
- Agree to a Code of Conduct this is a list of rules about how you should act.
