1. Chair Welcome & Introductions

2. Scene setting and Introductions – Phil McBryde/Richard Hoskin

There are 6 regional groups; these will be a forum for bringing together policy makers, scientists, fishermen and regulators in order to work together to compliment and deliver an intelligent approach to fisheries management.

This is picking up the Future of Our Inshore Fisheries action plan which came out of the conference. We are trying to move away from top-down one size fits all management as that approach doesn't work.

There are opportunities from having left the EU, we want to listen to your priorities and concerns to see how we can do things differently. These groups are a platform in which to elevate conversations, produce trials, pilots and collaborative science ideas.

There will be an opportunity for 1:1 surgery after meetings when we move into face to face environment.

These won't be perfect to start with and are expected to evolve. It is important that you feedback on these group meetings so we can collectively learn and improve.

Terms of Reference have been drafted and we will send those out after the meeting to be commented on before future meetings are held.

MMO / Defra will chair these meetings and provide a secretariat for the rest of the year but going forward you can recommend/ make suggestions for this role.

The objective is to work together and identify challenges with different regulators which affect your region.

ACTION: Defra to clarify roles and responsibilities of different bodies for next meeting.

The national group has not disbanded but we needed space to get the RFGs up and running. We will pick up national issues, but we want people on group to contribute ideas to agenda.

Attendance: towed gear feels like they are being picked on so can't be bothered to put themselves out there again. The green agenda is far too powerful and influential. A lot are whelking at the moment so maybe don't feel relevant.

3. Collaborative science

There is a link between this group, shellfish management groups and the Future of Our Inshore Fisheries action plan. We want ideas from you around collaboration you'd like to see and how to better utilise fishermen expertise.

Can we look at a BFT fishery? ICCAT plan makes provision for commercial bycatch. We are working through this, have no details for you at the moment but it's on the radar.

As people displaced from regulation, it's important that we look at sound science to shape management and effect of that (displacement and gear conflict).

Want to see more work on undulate ray as there are more on the ground that are bigger than ever.

Cuttle is more lack of management attention than lack of knowledge of the species. Would welcome the chance to take part in any project on cuttle.

Previously took part in Cefas trial using electronic callipers to measure shellfish. This was interesting and the device improved because of it.

Wind farms and magnetic fields around cable routes needs looking into. We are not seeing particular species now.

ACTION - Carl talk to Cefas colleagues looking at wind farm impacts.

Undulates are now eating baby thornbacks- can we check ICES advice is right? We have scientists who analyse stomach content who could collaborate on thornback issue.

Would like to understand predator prey relationship around crustaceans and interaction of food webs/ chains. Concern about state of lobster stocks within inshore and further afield.

4. Annual negotiations

Negotiations are still ongoing. The UK has extended TAC for the rest of year to give certainty, details are on gov.uk. If agreement is reached in negotiations, that would override the current provisional TAC.

VIId are doing well in terms of quota: a comparison with 2020 shows a decrease in cod, increase in plaice and similar amounts for skates and ray.

We are trying to improve science behind NQS to get a better state of those stocks. NQS is important to both sides which is why there is no agreement yet. TCA is set according to 2012-2016 reference period.

Fly shooting agreement was not a government agreement. We recognise that it was brokered by POs and doesn't cover all elements of industry. We are in favour of industry coming up with initiatives and solutions, but we are currently trying to understand this agreement.

Temporary solutions could be detrimental to the fleet long term. We need to juggle the problem and any unintended consequences.

Bass arrangements for 2020 have been rolled forward 2021. Discussions with EU haven't concluded so we hope modest changes are coming in July.

Bass stocks are recovering due to the measures which have been in place since 2015. Would be premature to say it has recovered sufficiently to allow targeting. Data is from last June, there will be an assessment in a few weeks for next year's advice.

5. <u>Quota management – Presentation (Sarah Allison)</u>

Sarah presented the Quota management presentation; group discussed stock and catch limits (see appendix 1).

6. <u>AOB</u>

There was big hope prior to TCA there would be additional quota significant enough to allow caps to be lifted. Challenge from TCA and implementation means progress on other priorities have been slowed e.g. licence review.

ACTION - Defra get timelines from Quota team.

NQS are coming under pressure because reassurance was given to those with caps that they could fish NQS. People have come to rely on them to a greater extent.

On increasing industry participation: hopefully you will have seen the benefit and will talk to other industry reps. Any thoughts on increasing attendance let us know.

Bass nursery report is due to be published mid-May, we'll flag it with you.

Agreement that quarterly is an acceptable Frequency unless something crops up. Where do we direct engagement in between?

ACTION - Defra/ MMO look at setting up shared mailbox.

Sole VIId	U10 have so much which is underutilised. Once whelks are gone, we will be targeting sole.	No comments
