

**MERCHANT SHIPPING NOTICE** 

# MSN XXX (M) The Workboat Code Edition 3

Notice to all designers, builders, owners, operators, employers, crews, masters of small workboats, pilot boats, remotely operated unmanned vessels, and Certifying Authorities.

This notice should be read with The Merchant Shipping (Small Workboats and Pilot Boats) Regulations 2023 (SI 2023/xxx) and replaces MSN 1892(M) and all previous Codes and Notices concerning small workboats and pilot boats.

#### Summary

This Merchant Shipping Notice (MSN) announces the latest amendment of the MCA publication "The Safety of Small Workboats and Pilot Boats – A Code of Practice" (formerly known as Edition 1 or the "Brown Code"). This revision will be known as Workboat Code Edition 3 and is underpinned by The Merchant Shipping (Small Workboats and Pilot Boats) Regulations 2023 (SI 2023/xxx), as amended, and is given affect by the provisions of Regulation 3(1).

The changes arising from the publication of Workboat Code Edition 3 apply to new vessels, constructed on or after  $\frac{xx \text{ Month } 2023}{x}$ . This MSN describes how this amendment of the Code is applicable to other small workboats and pilot boats certificated under previous editions of the Code.

### 1. Introduction

1.1 In 1998, the Maritime and Coastguard Agency published "The Safety of Small Workboats and Pilot Boats – A Code of Practice" (also known as the "Brown Code" and also

referred to as Edition 1 (1998)), under the provisions of Regulation 3(1) of the Merchant Shipping (Small Workboats and Pilot Boats) Regulations 1998<sup>1</sup>.

1.2 In 2018, the Agency published an updated version of the Code known as "The Workboat Code Edition 2" which replaced the Brown Code.

1.3 The latest edition of the Workboat Code has now been published as "The Safety of Small Workboats and Pilot Boats – A Code of Practice, known as "The Workboat Code Edition 3".

- 1.4 Workboat Code Edition 3 replaces:
  - The Safety of Small Workboats and Pilot Boats A Code of Practice Edition 1 (the "Brown Code");
  - b. MGN 280 Small Vessels in Commercial Use for Sport or Pleasure, Workboats and Pilot Boats Alternative Construction Standards, in so far as far as it applies to small workboats and pilot boats; and,
  - c. The Workboat Code Edition 2, as amended.

### 2. The Workboat Code Edition 3

2.1 Workboat Code Edition 3 came into force on xx Month 2023.

2.2 Workboat Code Edition 3 shall apply to new vessels which are certificated from the date of entry into force. Existing vessels certificated under the Brown Code, the technical Annex to MGN 280 or Workboat Code Edition 2 shall follow the transitional provisions of Appendix 9 of the Code to phase into compliance with Workboat Code Edition 3 over a longer period of time.

2.3 A "new vessel" is defined in the Code as "a vessel, the keel of which was laid, or the construction or lay-up was started, on or after the first day on which this revised Code came into force, or any vessel where there has not been a valid certificate for the previous five years." An existing vessel is defined as "a vessel which is not a new vessel."

2.4 The transitional requirements for existing vessels are outlined in the table in Appendix 9 of the Code. Such vessels may continue operating in compliance with the previous standards until the date or examination shown, after which they shall comply in full with the requirements set out in the Workboat Code Edition 3.

2.5 Workboat Code Edition 3 has been developed in consultation with an industry working group. It includes updates necessary as a response to accidents relevant to the workboat industry and incorporates those amendments which have taken place in the relevant international conventions<sup>2</sup>.

2.6 Other flag states, who wish to apply Workboat Code Edition 3 according to their own requirements and laws, may take full advantage of its availability.
