To whom it may concern

Please accept my objection to the application for 130 homes off Henham road Elsenham by Countryside.

I live in the "village" of [REDACTED] not too far from this proposed development and to lose such a beautiful part of the "village" would be extremely tragic.

I use "village" as the amount of new developments we have had to endure has lost the area of its village title. We are now just a collection of housing estates with one tiny shop.

There is no infrastructure for this many new houses, the doctors are at breaking point, the school which used to have 60 pupils in the whole school now has 60 per year which still is not enough!

This is the last green space left in the "village", the extensive development being built opposite has already ruined the countryside from that direction.

The roads are ridiculous! They are not big enough for this level of traffic and it is no longer a safe place to drive or walk. The high street is clogged up with cars and the pavements are so tight it really is frightening to walk with children along there with lorries hurtling past over the speed limit. Hall road which is right next to the development is too narrow, too fast and full of pot holes. Grove hill the access from Stansted is a joke – two cars can get through at a time and it is constantly being blocked up. And the access from Ugley is too narrow and dangerous. The access from Henham where the other new development will be will also be dangerous as the access road is being put just before the bend.

Please listen to reason and stop developing on what's left of the once village of Elsenham.
