As a resident of Henham [REDACTED], I am horrified to read about this proposed development on the last remaining green space in Elsenham, which I vehemently oppose.

As with all recent and proposed expansion plans for the village, no account has been taken on the impact on infrastructure, in particular the appalling nature of the local country roads. Just one example being the road from the Crown to Mole Hill Green, which adjoins the proposed development. It is full of potholes, not very wide and has been poorly maintained for years.

I would also question what research has been undertaken on the full impact on local services, such as the school and the village surgery, which we understand are full, and therefore heaping extra pressure and vehicle congestion on adjoining.

Lastly, this development, together with the adjoining one which has just started, will generate up to 900 extra cars on our roads. The (you) authorities, are asking us to become 'greener', to plant trees and have electric cars etc. You then allow the bulldozers in to scrub out all that precious green open space, to be replaced by housing.

Where is all the electricity and water coming from as well?

Enough is enough. Please refuse this latest blatant despoliation of our beautiful village countryside. We don't want to live in a town.
