II.1 Health attestation

4.1 The birds(s) is/are 'pet animals' as defined in Article 3(b) of Regulation (EU) No 576/2013 intended for non-commercial movement.

4.2 During the period between the pre-movement veterinary inspection and the actual departure the bird(s) will remain isolated from any possible contact with any other bird(s).
