We are objecting strongly to this application.

1. There are already horrendous traffic problems. Living in the village of Henham to get into Stansted and further on to Bishops Stortford, we are currently held up particularly at Grove Hill and Chapel Hill and the pollution caused by this congestion is totally unacceptable. To access the towns any other way means negotiation a very narrow rural road, with huge potholes.
2. Transport is limited and there is no bus service into Saffron Walden from Henham meaning the roads that way are very bad and over used by cars and lorries etc.
