Dear Planning Inspectorate,

Regarding the subject application, I would like to object on the following grounds:

- the site is one of the last remaining local dog walking routes, which many villagers use on a daily basis
- the infrastructure has not been improved at all since any of the developments have started and now cannot cope with the amount of residents. This includes: nhs dentists, local shops and most importantly the roads. Whilst I appreciate there are 5 ways out of the village, the main one to get anywhere worthwhile is via grove hill, Stansted, which is at breaking point.
- the villages are losing their community spirit with the rapid growth
- we are losing our green space at an alarming pace
- flooding in the village is getting worse every year. This will just get worse with our fields being built on.

I do appreciate that houses need to be built, but I most certainly think that Elsenham just needs a bit of a break!

I do hope you take into consideration local residents views.
