It is my understanding that an application has been submitted for another 200 houses to be added as a bolt on to the 350 houses already approved on the Bloor site abutting Elsenham on Henham Parish Land.

How can the roads surrounding sustain this development?? Transport time to surrounding secondary schools already has at least tripled, what used to be a 20 minute journey into Bishops Stortford to take our son to Birchwood High School now takes about an hour, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and this is how much the travel time has increased in such a short time already with all the developments surrounding.

At present I am struggling to find a local NHS dentist who is willing to take on my 2 children as patients ([REDACTED]) I cannot afford the £40 each check up charge privately so at present, they have no dentist which is affecting their health, the doctors cannot cope, its a nightmare to get appointments and that's if you can manage to get through on the phone to them!

How can 800 dwellings be rejected previously by a secretary of state saying the application was not sustainable yet the current proposal for an extra 200 houses will take the total area dwellings approved to over 1000? It just doesn't add up.
