

North East - Existing adopted Local Plans and saved policies

Introduction

In the North East 13 current local authorities have adopted local plans. Development plan documents which were adopted shortly before the date of publication of the Regional Spatial Strategy in July 2008 will have been prepared in parallel with preparation of the Regional Strategy, and so are likely to have anticipated and may have reflected its policies. For the purposes of preparing this Environmental Report it has been assumed that only development plan documents adopted during 2008 or afterwards are in general conformity. On this basis 4 local authorities have core strategies in place which are in general conformity with both the requirements of the 2004 Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act and the policies set out within the North East Plan. The other 9 authorities in the region have local plans at different stages of development, with adopted plans put in place before the North East Plan was adopted in July 2008 and therefore not necessarily in general conformity with the regional policies. These include two unitary authorities where, pending completion of their own core strategies, the local plan comprises the adopted core strategies and other development plan documents and/or adopted local plan saved policies of 13 former local authorities.

There are 13 mineral and waste authorities. Five authorities have worked together to prepare minerals and waste policies under a single plan or core strategy, and two more are in the process of doing so. Others are working individually and have separate minerals and waste policies, and authority includes minerals and waste policies form part of its wider Core Strategy. Of the 11 (in total) plans covering minerals and waste policies, 2 are in general conformity with the policies set out within the North East Plan since they were adopted in or after July 2008, or shortly beforehand, and 9 which were adopted well before July 2008 and therefore not necessarily in general conformity with the regional plan.

These Plans would form part of the Development Plan in the absence of the Revoked Regional Strategy.

Table 1 shows a summary of the policies/targets for Housing provision, Gypsy and Traveller (including Travelling Showpeople) pitches or sites, Renewables, and Employment Land within the North East Plan and those in adopted local authority plans and core strategies and other DPDs.

Table 2 presents a summary of the Mineral and Waste policies/targets within the North East Plan and those in mineral and waste plans adopted before and after the North East Plan was adopted.
