## PCGN Meeting Minutes, Monday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2022 Royal Geographical Society, London

## Present

PCGN Staff Defence Geographic Centre (DGC) Foreign Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) BBC Monitoring (BBCM) Ordnance Survey (OS) United Kingdom Hydrographic Office (UKHO) Apologies for absence: Royal Scottish Geographical Society and Defence Language Service.

- 1. Head PCGN welcomed the Committee members.
- 2. The Minutes of the 207<sup>th</sup> meeting were considered and action items discussed.
- 3. Head PCGN briefly described highlights of the work completed by the PCGN staff since the last meeting.
- BGN and PCGN had held a second virtual meeting in September 2021. Policy papers covering a wide range of subjects had been prepared and discussed. Arrangements for the next in-person BGN/PCGN Conference for autumn 2023 were currently being discussed.
- 5. PCGN described their work with the ISO 3166 standard on country and subdivision codes, and on ISO's Working Group on Conversion of Written Languages.
- 6. The third new-style Session of the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names (UNGEGN) would be held in May 2023 in New York.
- 7. UKHO gave an update on their plans to move from paper and digital charting to digital only navigation products and services.
- 8. FCDO reported that the three-year update of FCDO briefing maps was nearly complete. Updated FCDO Travel Advice pages would be created in the coming months; the names should continue to reflect PCGN advice.
- 9. BBCM reported on some of the recent names decisions by BBC News policy.



- 10. DGC described their work updating various map products, including Briefing Maps and Country Managed Datasets.
- 11. OS described their recent work with UN-GGIM.
- 12. PCGN provided an update on recent work on the BGN/PCGN Romanization System collection. PCGN introduced the latest BGN/PCGN Romanization System for Neo-Tifinagh. All the latest systems were available on the <u>PCGN website</u>.
- PCGN had recently produced 18 new Toponymic Factfiles and updated several others. The Factfiles were available on <u>PCGN's website</u>.
