# Grenfell Tower site update: summary of community online meeting

## Grenfell Tower site update: summary of community online meeting

At the online meeting on 6 December 2022, we updated attendees on:

- Maintenance and safety works at the tower. The installation of 'props' (metal supports) in the basement is now complete and weekly inspections are ongoing. No further propping work is planned.
- Lancaster West Estate residents can access the garages under the walkway blocks by contacting the site management team. See the contact details at the end of this summary.
- The next phase of the refurbishment of the Lancaster West Estate is scheduled to start early 2023. Find out more at [www.wearew11.org/en](http://www.wearew11.org/en)

- The procurement process for a replacement contractor for local air quality monitoring. Air quality monitoring continues to be carried out regularly around the tower to provide reassurance to the local community. You can see this month's monitoring results on [GOV.UK](http://GOV.UK)
- The recent power cut on the Lancaster West Estate. UK Power Networks (UKPN), which is responsible for the electricity network, traced the fault to an area within the Grenfell Tower site. They installed a temporary generator to supply electricity to residents without power while they investigated the fault.
