

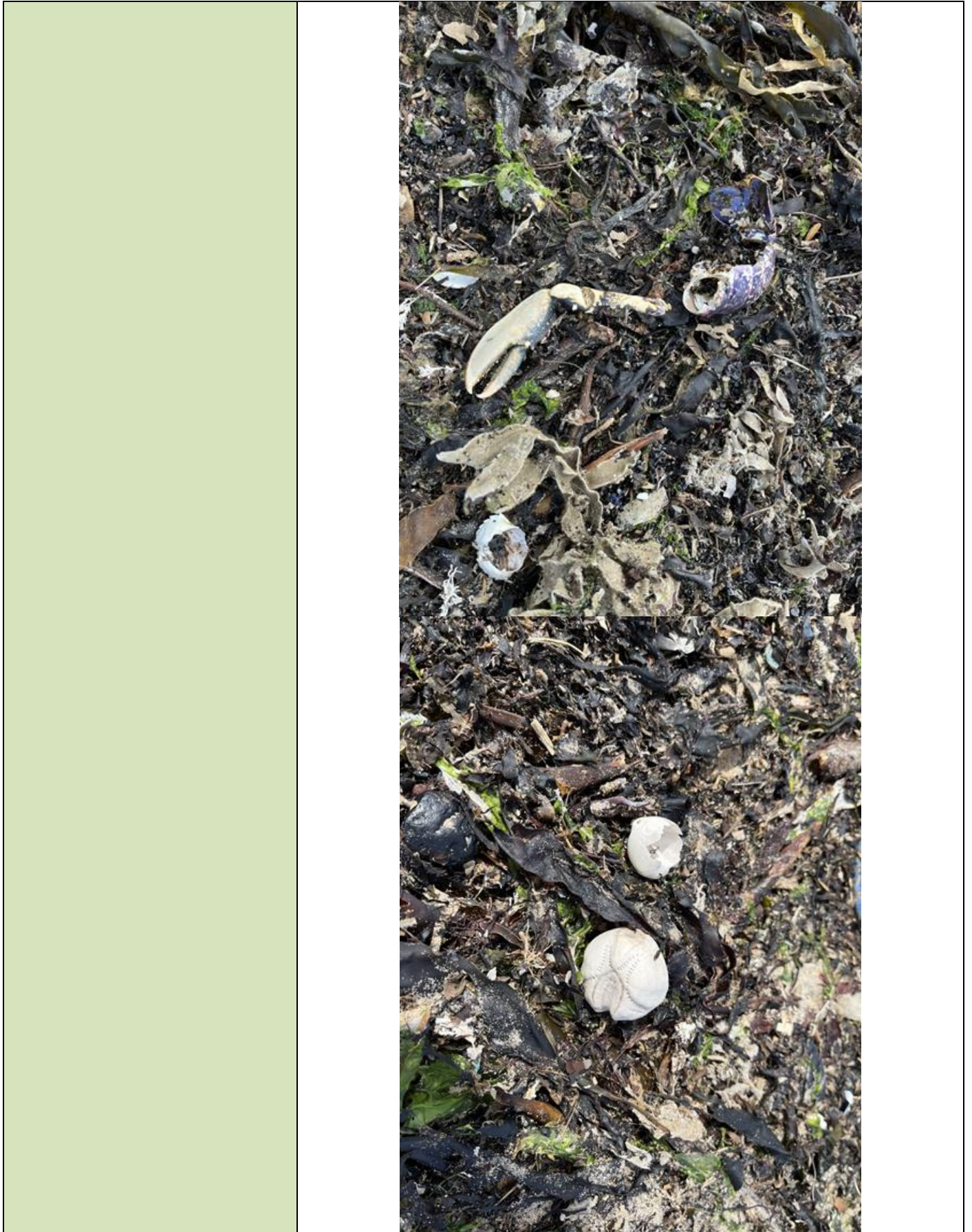

They attach to the gills and through stages absorb all the oxygen out of the lobsters resulting in death. If the lobsters moult they can get rid of the parasites.

Skipper told officers that he had two lobsters that had died in the pots recently and after speaking to the merchant on losing his 13% of lobster catch, he lifted the carapaces of the dead lobsters. The two dead lobsters were covered in the parasites as seen and shown by the merchant from the day before.

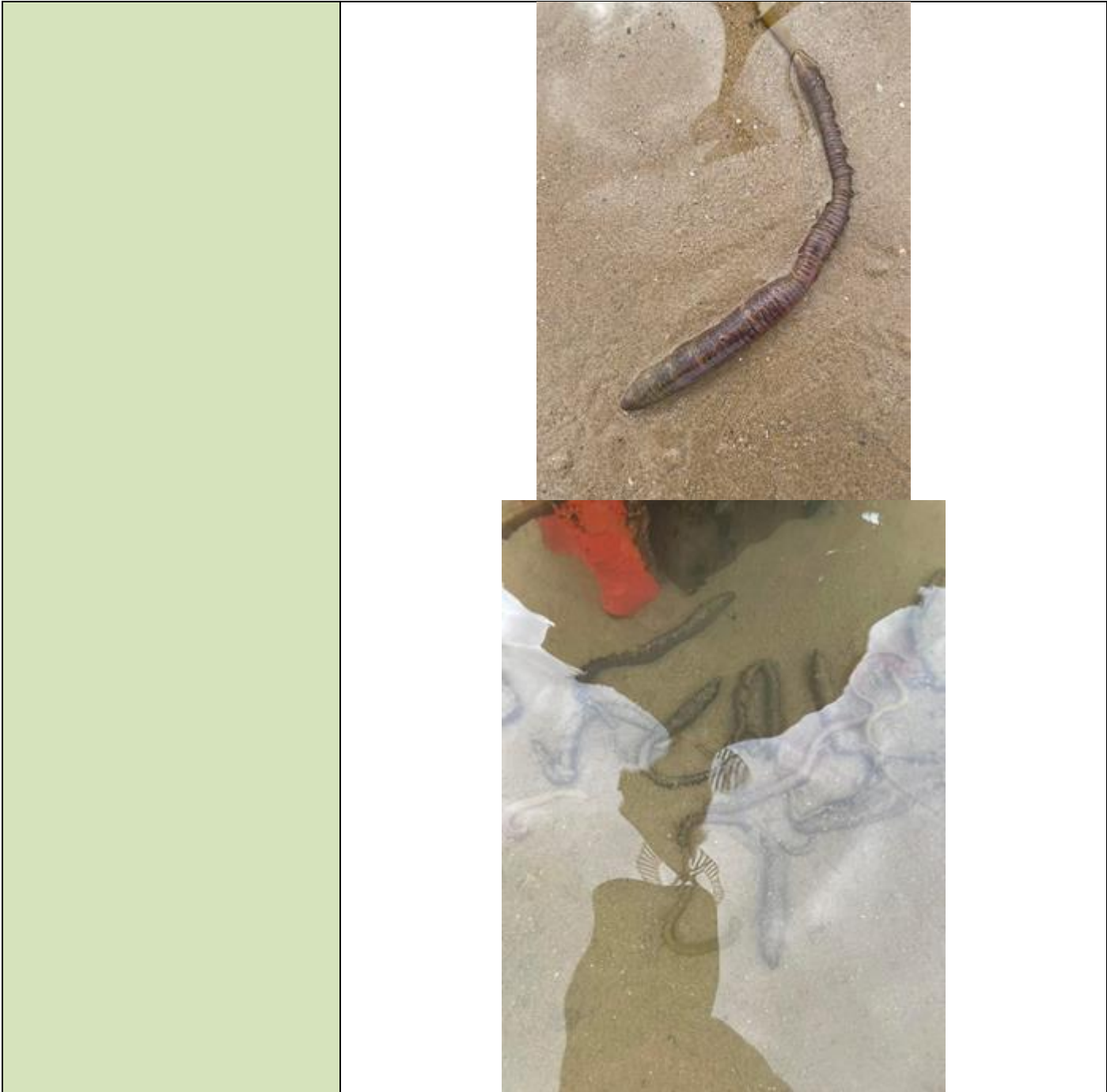

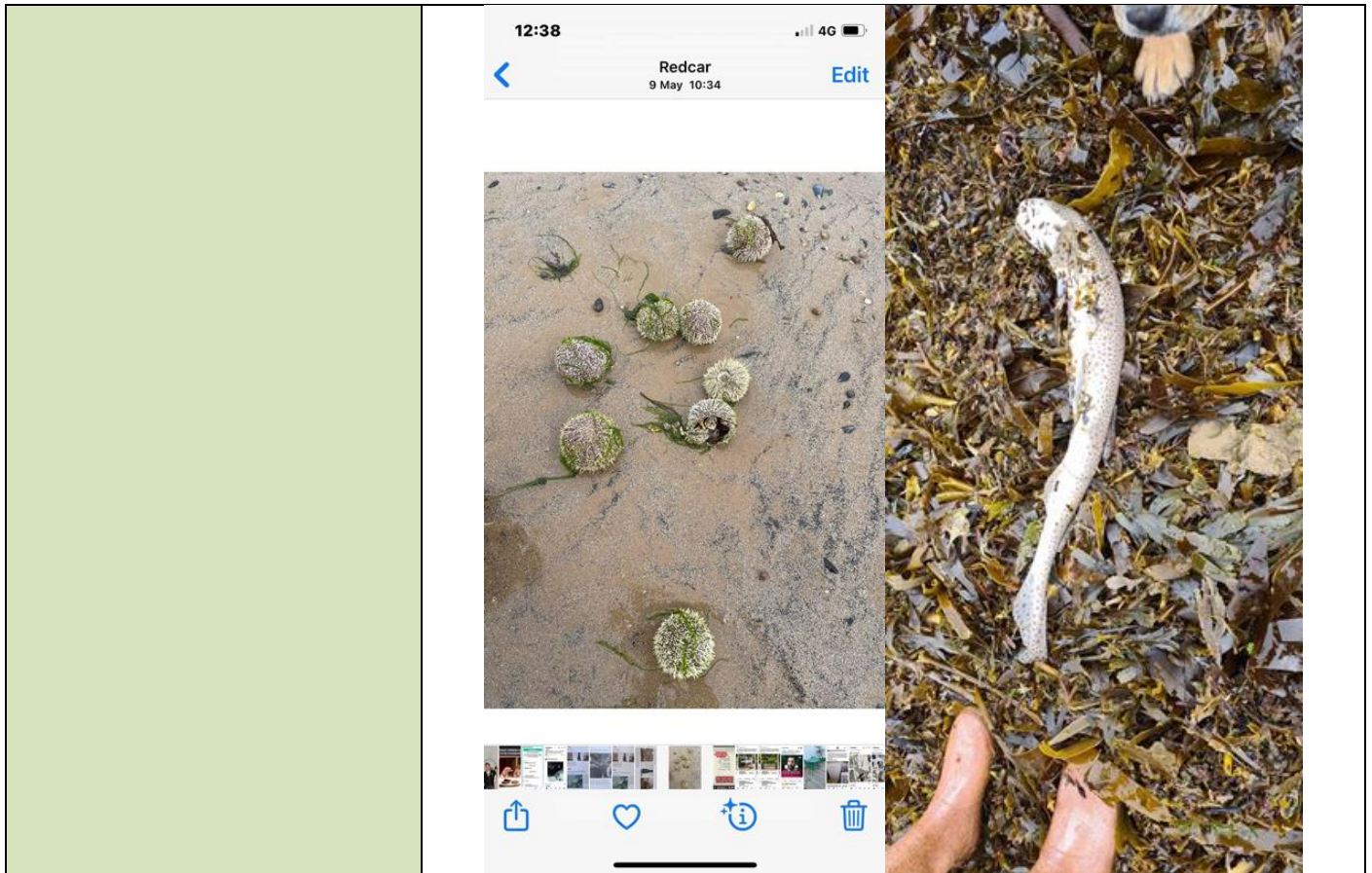

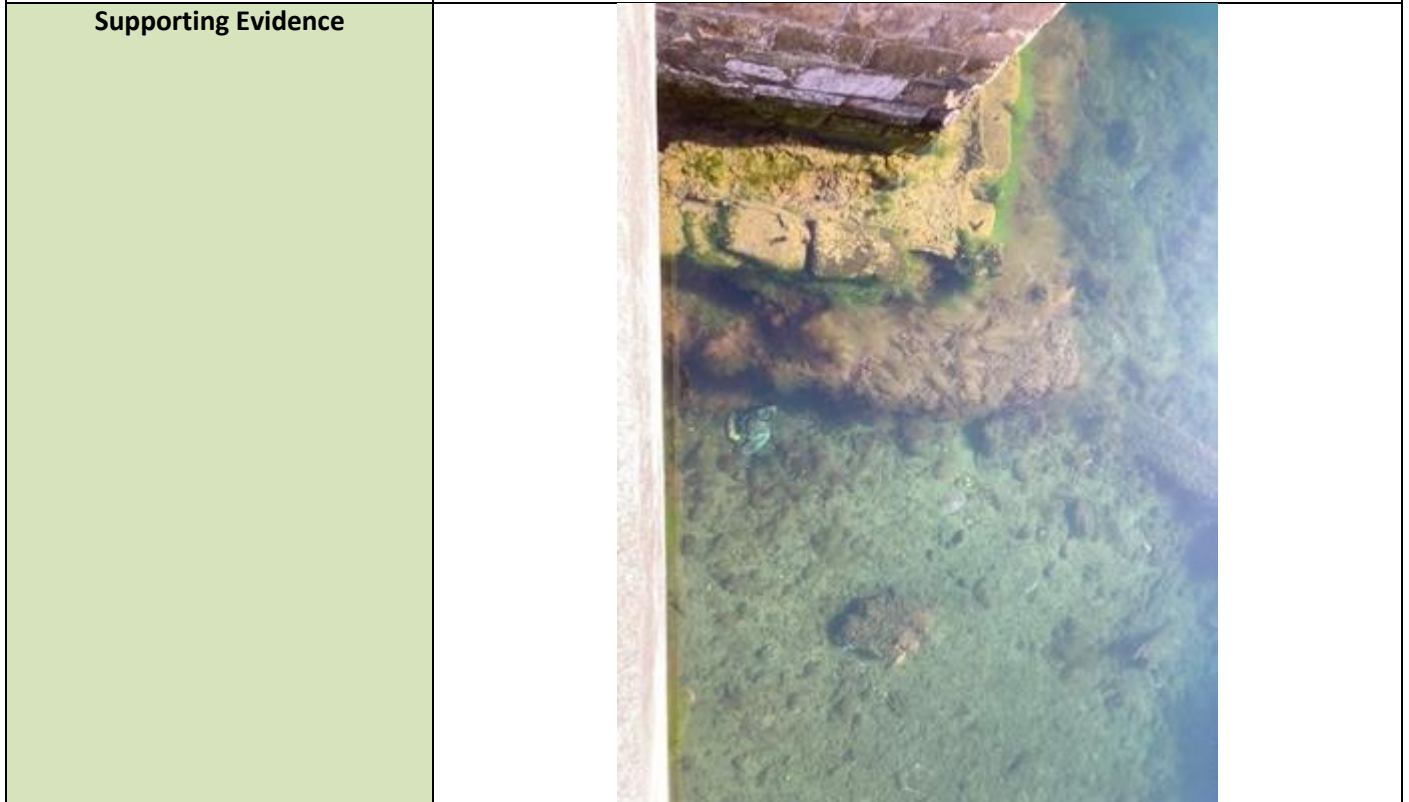

Fisherman	<p>Email received from fisherman of an email he had sent to MP Jill Mortimer regarding the recent mortality events. Email advises the large resident lobster in Hartlepool marina which has been a local attraction for years has died, and there was no sign of normal crabs and lobsters in the marina. Also advises that hobby potters have not been catching anything from Victoria Dock where a few months ago there were catching a lobster every day/every other day and not seeing dogger/shore crabs.</p> <p>Email also includes information he received from a person who has a yacht in the area stating they had been sailing in Hartlepool Bay the day before and passed a dead baby dolphin alongside the boat (the juvenile dolphin was approximately 2.5 to 3 feet long. He also states that this was reported to him in conjunction with reports of numerous porpoises washed up on beaches since the dredging. Email has a photo attached of a dead porpoise washed up on 28/02/2022 from the fish sands. Fisherman states that none of the agencies he had contacted were interested in removing it or testing it and said it had been too long since the dredging finished.</p> <p>The email goes on to describe the amount of chemical waste (figure stated was 5,000 tonnes a day) that was dumped in the River Tees during the 50's, 60's and 70's.</p> <p>Fisherman states that a full judicial review is the only thing that could save the marine environment from wider destruction.</p>	


Also states that neither himself nor a fellow fisherman have earned a living from fishing shellfish within the 6nm limit since the end of September 2021. Also states that the deeper water fishers are struggling now and that in 5 weeks time the freeport dredging will start and that any other year this would have been the start of the main shellfish fishery there.

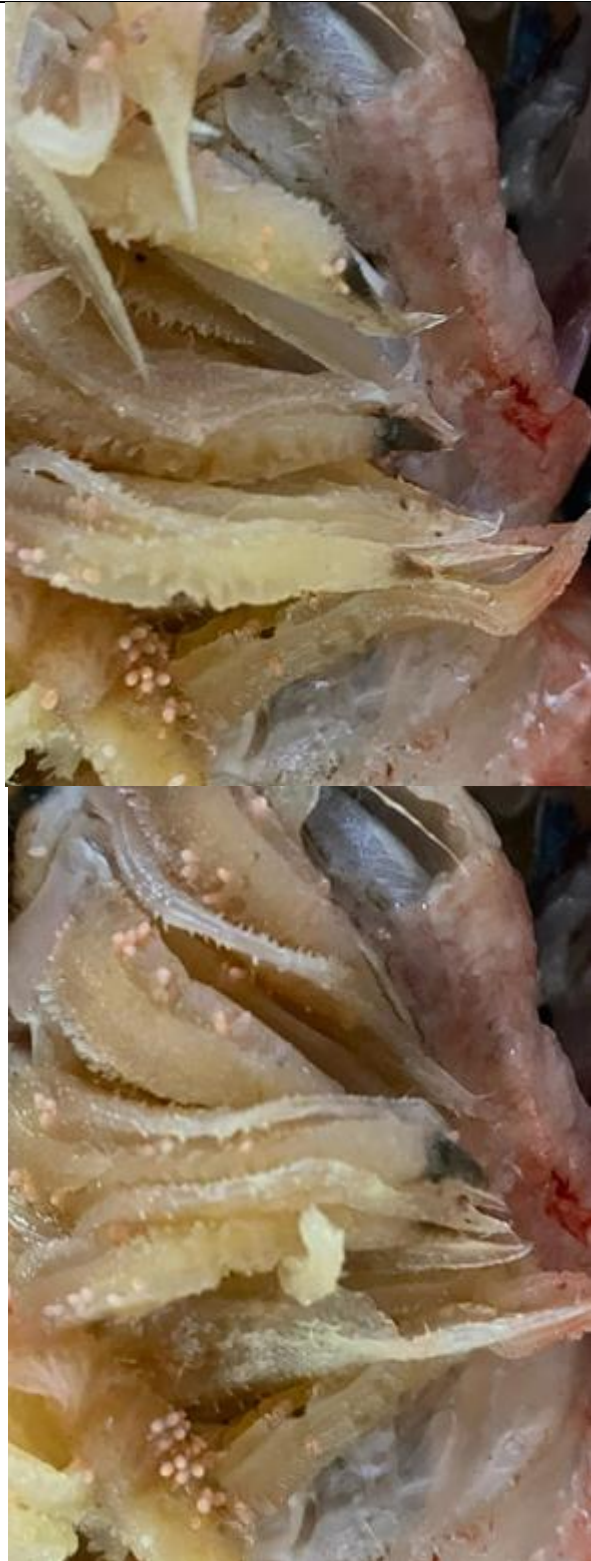

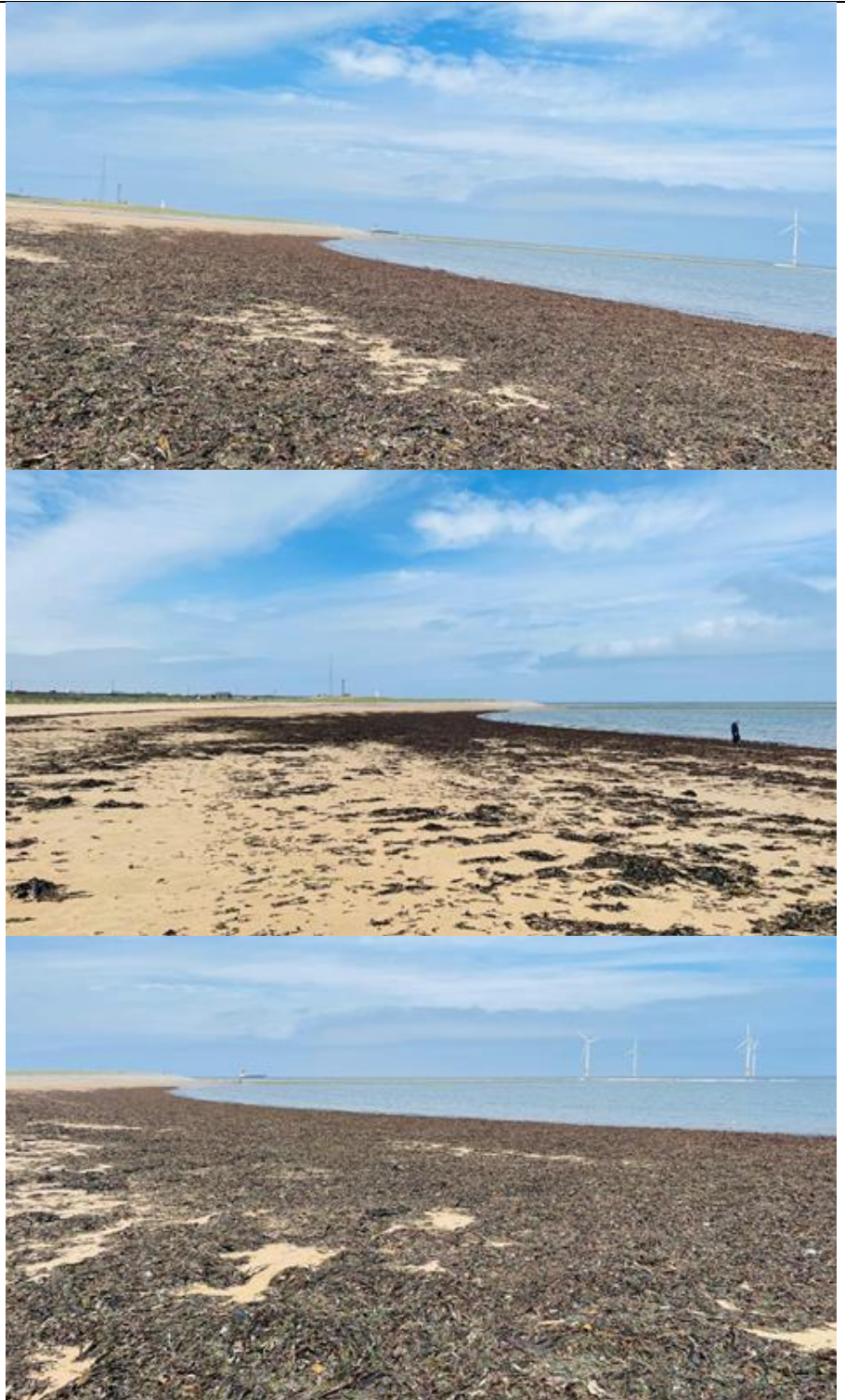

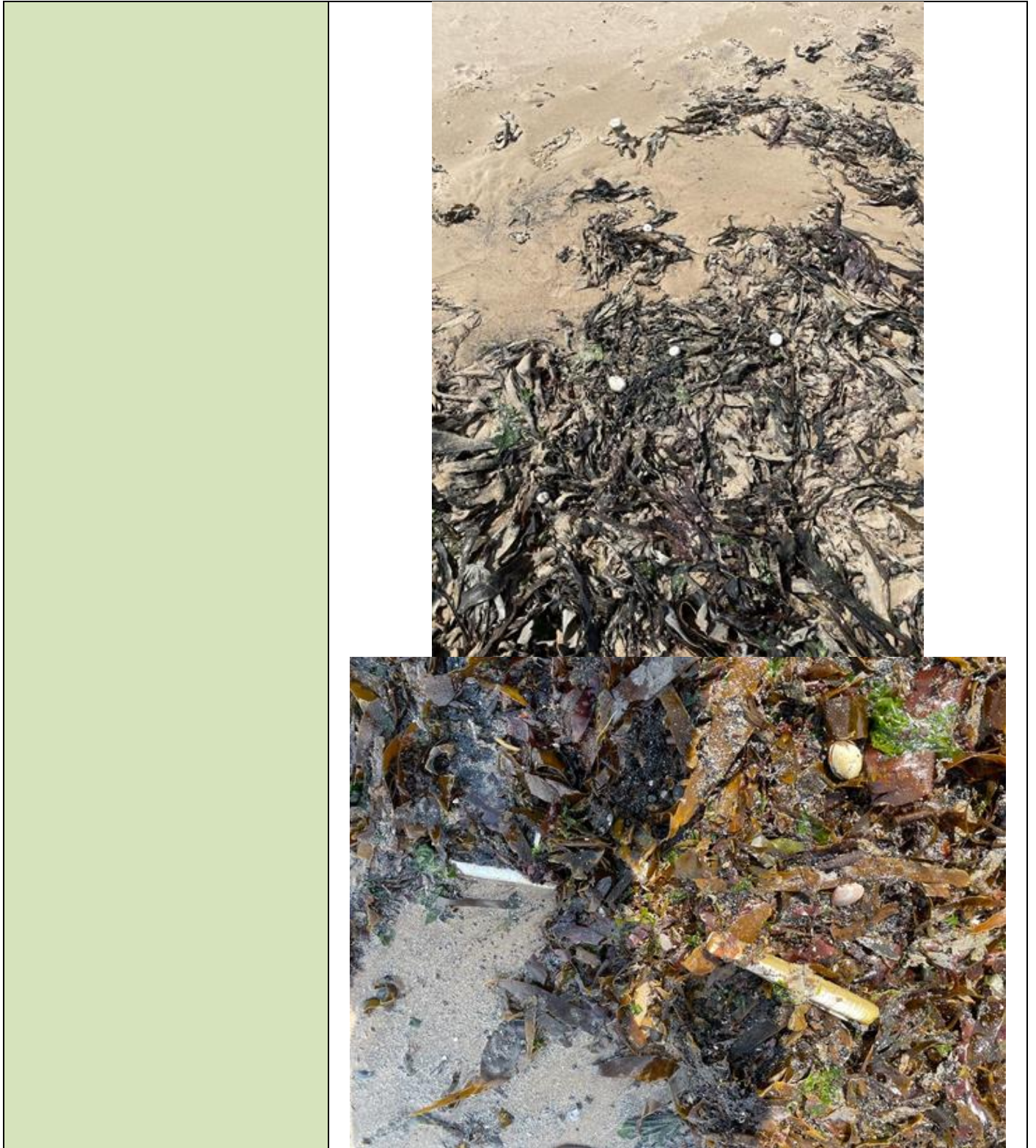
