Introduction

Bulgaria lies in the eastern Balkans on the Black Sea and shares land boundaries with Serbia, Romania, Greece, North Macedonia and Turkey. The Danube river forms most of the boundary with Romania and the country's topography is characterised broadly by mountains in the west and plains in the east towards the Black Sea. Bulgaria is the poorest member state of the EU, and is facing population decline.

Geographical names policy

PCGN policy for Bulgaria is to use official sources from Bulgaria and romanize these according to the agreed [BGN/PCGN romanization system for Bulgarian](#). In 2013 BGN and PCGN agreed to adopt Bulgaria's 2009 national romanization system, so that any official mapping and sources produced in Roman script in Bulgaria should align with US and UK government products.

Official mapping is produced by Bulgaria's Geodesy, Cartography and Cadastre Agency. The Agency maintains a geoportal at: <https://gkf.cadastre.bg/> and a Register of geographical names: <https://geonames.cadastre.bg/> Names in the latter are shown in Bulgarian language (see more in *Languages*, below) and should be used as the authoritative source.

The US Board on Geographic Names (BGN) [Geographic Names Server](#) (GNS) database is also a good source for geographical names.

Languages

Bulgarian (*bul*), written in the Bulgarian Cyrillic alphabet, is the national official language; it is a southern Slavic language, close to Macedonian. A number of minority languages are spoken, the most widespread being Turkish (*tur*) (almost 10% as native language) and two Romani (*rom*) languages (together about 4%)³. Minority languages do not have official status; minority names can be collected and used on HMG products if deemed useful, though official Bulgarian sources are unlikely to include these⁴.

Writing systems and romanization

Bulgarian is written in the Bulgarian Cyrillic alphabet, which PCGN and BGN romanize using the Bulgarian national romanization system approved for US and UK use in 2013.

The romanization system is a straightforward ‘one for one’ representation between the original Cyrillic and Roman scripts; there are two exceptions: when in final position, /ия/ is romanized as /ia/ (София = Sofia) and /ъ/, elsewhere romanized /a/, is represented with /u/ in the country name. These exceptions allow for the romanized form: България = Bulgaria.

The Bulgarian romanization system does not use any special characters or diacritical marks in addition to the basic Roman alphabet (characters /ж/, /ц/, /ч/ and /ш/ are represented with digraphs /zh/, /ts/, /ch/ and /sh/ in their romanized form).

If encountered, Turkish names will be written in Roman script (and these names should be reflected as found, retaining any diacritical marks). Romani has traditionally been unwritten, and Romani language variants usually follow the orthography of the relevant national language (e.g. Romanian or Hungarian). There is little recognised use in Bulgaria, though if it is encountered it is likely to be written in Roman script.

Ethnicity

Over 78% of the population recorded itself as Bulgarian in the 2021 Census; other significant groups are Turkish, 8%, and Romani, 4%. It is possible, however, that this number under represents the Romani population, given the group has suffered discrimination which often affects self-identification.

³ Romani or Romany (*rom*) is considered a macro-language with divergent variations: the forms mostly spoken in Bulgaria are Balkan Romani (*rmn*) and Vlax Romani (*rmy*) with some 600,000 speakers (SIL International estimate) across the Balkans.

⁴ For example, the province with the highest Turkish population density is Kardzhali. This is Kircaali in Turkish, but this name does not appear on official maps or the geoportal.

Administrative structure

Bulgaria is divided into 28 units at the first-order level of administration: 27 provinces (oblast) and 1 city province: Sofia-grad. Each of the provinces takes the name of its administrative centre and the provinces may be seen with the specific name in an adjectival form (e.g. *Blagoevgradska oblast*). The nominal form without the generic term is shown in the table below.
