Purpose of the London Air Quality and Healthy Delivery Group

The purpose of the multi-agency partnership is to coordinate and take forward pan-London joint work on air quality across the health and care system.

It provides the strategic leadership to ensure that poor air quality is prioritised as a determinant of poor health outcomes and a key driver of health inequalities in London.

Scope, aims and responsibilities

The Delivery Group will:

- coordinate and take forward pan-London joint work on air quality across the health and care system
- ensure that poor air quality is recognised and prioritised as a determinant of poor health outcomes and a key driver of health inequalities in London
- seek to create and maximise alignment with key pillars of the work inherent to the [Delivering a 'Net Zero' National Health Service](#) report
- be the focal point for owning, tracking and coordinating the delivery of the London Clean Air and Health Summit commitments in February 2022

The work of the Delivery Group will be supported by the [Air Quality and Health Programme Office](#).

Accountability

The Air Quality and Health Delivery Group will be accountable to the Health Equity Delivery Group.

Frequency of meetings

The Delivery Group will meet every 4 weeks and otherwise as required.

Administrative support for the Delivery Group will be provided by the Air Quality and Health Programme Office and dates, agenda and accompanying papers will be circulated in advance.

Functional arrangements

The Delivery Group aims to co-ordinate activities, discuss issues and agree on any proposals or recommendations required.

Interim business can be administered by email and ad-hoc meetings.

Sub-groups will be organised as required.

Review

The remit and function of the Air Quality and Health Delivery Group will be reviewed after 12 months.
