Tree Preservation Order (TPO) charges	<p>There will be a duplication of Tree Preservation Order (TPO) records if there is more than one tree or tree group within the search area.</p> <p>Due to the structure of the data held, each spatial extent that has been given to a TPO will be revealed as a separate charge. This could be an individual polygon representing a group of trees or a point representing a single tree.</p>	<p>Before: One charge for the whole TPO would be revealed</p> <p>After: Multiple charges would be revealed with the same Authority Reference, which is the TPO number and the extent area for each one showing an individual tree/tree group covered by the TPO</p>
Pipeline charge	<p>The defence pipeline has been consolidated into one charge with the information updated, the most notable of which is the change of further information location from a postal address to a telephone number/email address.</p>	<p>Before: For further information please contact Fisher German, GPSS, PO Box 7273, Ashby De La Zouch, LE65 2B7</p> <p>After: Exolum Pipeline System own and operate high pressure oil/fuel pipelines around the UK. <p>Peak District National Park (PDNP) charges</p>	<p>All Peak District National Park (PDNP) charges within the High Peak boundary have now been added into the same register as the High Peak Borough Council (HPBC) charges.</p> <p>This involved a gap analysis to identify any planning applications that PDNP held in their register, which hadn't been sent to HPBC.</p> <p>Due to some applications appearing in both datasets but having different reference formats in the PDNP and HPBC data, some planning applications may have been created as 2 charges.</p>	<p>Before: High Peak Borough Council would reveal any charges they held in their register for a property within the Peak District National Park and then the customer would have to get any remaining charges direct from the Peak District National Park</p> <p>After: All Local Land Charges will now be held on the HMLR register however, there is the possibility that the same planning application will be revealed twice, once with a HPBC reference, and once with a PDNP reference (other information will match) e.g. 2 charges with the same description, registration date, location etc. but one has an authority reference of HPK1100155 (PDNP reference) and another HPK/0003/9563 (HPBC reference)</p>
<p>Pre 1974 conservation areas</p>	<p>Previously conservation areas that were designated before 1974 were not revealed on a search result, however due to the structure of how the data is held at High Peak Borough Council, they will now be shown on search results</p>	<p>Before: Only the parts of the conservation area designated after 1974 would be revealed on a search for Buxton Central, Chapel en le Frith, Hayfield, Norfolk Square and Old Glossop conservation areas</p> <p>After: All parts of the conservation area will now be revealed on a search result however, any charges relating to the area designated pre 1974 will have this information in the description 'PRE-1974 CONSERVATION AREA'</p>
<p>Further information location</p>	<p>Further information location was previously given as a postal address. For Conditional planning consent, Ancient monuments, Listed building and No permitted development / article 4 charges, a web address has been used instead to allow customers to self-serve.</p>	<p>Before: A postal address was given for the originating authority e.g. 'Town Hall, Market Place, Buxton, High Peak'</p> <p>After: Where further information is available online, the website address has been used e.g. 'https://historicengland.org.uk/listing/the-list/'</p>
