Item 1: Introduction

 The Chair welcomed attendees to the meeting. Apologies for absence had been received from Lila Ibrahim, Professor David Lane, Dr Claire Craig, Professor Neil Lawrence, Professor Pete Burnap, and Priya Lakhani.

Items 2 and 3: Update on the Al Strategy and Al priorities for 2023 with an overview of initial responses to the Al white paper from the Viscount Camrose, Minister for Artificial Intelligence and Intellectual Property

- The Chair formally welcomed Viscount Camrose to the meeting, congratulating the Minister on his appointment.
- Viscount Camrose thanked the Council for its input into the AI regulation white paper, published in March 2023. The Minister set out his priorities for the implementation of the AI regulatory framework and recent Government announcements on AI, including the Foundation Model Taskforce.
- A detailed discussion followed during which members gave insights on a wide-range
 of issues including data, intellectual property and international engagement, as well
 as regulatory coordination and the proposed central functions in the AI regulation
 white paper.

Item 4: Al Council members are invited to discuss the Al regulation white paper

- The Head of Al Regulation at the Office of Al updated members on the publication of the Al regulation white paper.
- Discussion followed during which members proposed learning lessons from the monitoring ambition of the UK Data Strategy, highlighted public trust as a key lever, and emphasised the importance of both granularity and scalability within the Al regulatory framework.
- Members were asked some of the key questions for Government consultation regarding a cross-sectoral risk framework, horizon scanning, and monitoring and evaluation of the regulatory framework. The Chair agreed to convene a smaller group of members to discuss these questions.

<u>Item 5: Update on the Foundation Model Taskforce</u>

- The Head of Digital Regulation, as Head of the new Foundation Model Taskforce (FMTF), in DSIT provided members with an update on the development of the FMTF and the announcement of an initial £100 million of funding to support its work.
- Members offered their support for the FMTF and welcomed ongoing engagement as it develops.

Item 6: Presentation on the Global Talent Network and Al Futures

- Officials from DBT presented to members about the Government's AI Futures
 programme to attract the next generation of AI talent to the UK and provided an
 overview of the Global Talent Network.
- Members noted the importance of retaining as well as attracting talent and gave suggestions on how best to engage emerging AI leaders around the world, including building on existing Government AI skills programmes and providing access to data.
