Number	Name of the claimant	Coronation Claim	Outcome of claim and role performed
1	Antonia Romeo, Clerk of the Crown in Chancery	To record the proceedings and have five yards of cloth	Claim established. Performed the role of recording the proceedings only.
2	The Earl of Erroll	To bear a silver baton or staff as Lord High Constable of Scotland at the service in The King's Procession	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
3	Barons of the Cinque Ports	To have honours at court to perform their services, including carrying a canopy over the Monarch in The King's Procession	Claim established. As there was no canopy in procession attendance was approved in honour of the historic claim (14 members).
4	The Lord Great Chamberlain	To carry out the duties of the office of the Lord Great Chamberlain in the service	Claim established and role performed was to present the spurs to His Majesty in the service.
5	Lord Hastings	To bear the Golden Spurs in The King's Procession	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
6	Earl of Loudoun	To bear the Golden Spurs in The King's Procession	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
7	Bishop of Durham	To be Bishop Assistant to HM King Charles III	Claim established and performed the role claimed.

8	Bishop of Bath and Wells	To be Bishop Assistant to HM King Charles III	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
9	The Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of St Peter	To hold the ceremony and instruct the monarch in the forms, rites and ceremonies	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
10	The Lord Mayor of London	To bear the Crystal Mace in procession through the Abbey in The King's Procession	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
11	The Earl of Dundee	To carry the Quartering of the Standard (Scotland) in The King's Procession	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
12	The Lord Lyon King of Arms & Heralds and Pursuivants of Scotland	To attend the Coronation, and accorded the usual place in the ceremonies and The King's Procession	Claim established and performed the role claimed.
13	The Walker Trust (Episcopal Archbishop of England)	To be Usher of the White Rod at the Coronation Service	Claim established. There was no Usher of the White Rod in procession. Instead attendance was approved in honour of the historic claim
