Chairperson - Professor Christine Watson

Christine is an experienced Chair of both national and international committees and is currently a Professor of Agricultural Systems at Scotland's Rural College (SRUC). She holds the KSLA Wallenberg Professorship at SLU (Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences).

Her research focuses on the management of micro and macro nutrients in organic and conventional agri-food systems at a range of scales from local to continental. Over the past 5 years much of her research has focused on assessing and developing legume-based farming systems in Europe and Africa.

She is also a co-chair of SRUC's Athena SWAN Self-Assessment Team, and a member of their Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Committee. Formally she was the President of the UK Association of Applied Biologists and the European Society for Agronomy.
