Grenfell Tower site update June 2023

A summary of current activity at the Grenfell Tower site.

Sixth anniversary of the Grenfell Tower tragedy

- There will be community-led commemorations for the sixth anniversary of the Grenfell Tower tragedy. We are working in support of the community, which may mean local residents see more people in the area of the tower site as visitors come to pay their respects.
- Grenfell Tower will be illuminated in green from 8pm on 13 June to 6am on 14 June, and from 8pm to 11pm on 14 June.
- Later this month, there will be a debate in the House of Commons to mark six years since the tragedy. The debate will be on Grenfell's legacy, and the government will provide an update on the action it is taking on social housing and building safety. The date will be confirmed soon. Traffic monitoring

- The Grenfell Tower Memorial Commission is gathering data to understand how people and traffic use the area around the tower site. This will help the Memorial Commission in their planning for a future memorial.
- CCTV cameras will be installed temporarily around the tower site in the week beginning 26 June to survey pedestrian and traffic movements, which will help develop plans for a future memorial. Data will be collected from Thursday 29 June to Sunday 2 July. The equipment will then be removed. Should there be any other changes about this, we will let you know as soon as possible.
- The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities is organising this work in its capacity of providing administrative support to the Memorial Commission. Other updates

- Tower site contractors, DUK, carry out regular maintenance and checks of the props (metal supports installed in the tower), the hoardings around the site, lighting and security systems and scaffolding.
- Air quality monitoring continues to be carried out regularly around the tower. [You can see this month's monitoring results on GOV.UK](#) The UK Health Security Agency has procured a replacement contractor for air quality monitoring at the Grenfell Tower site. This is a standard process and will maintain the air quality monitoring arrangements established by Public Health England. If you have
