

TRANSPORT AND WORKS ACT 1992

The Breath Analysis Devices Approval 2004

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 31(1)(a) of the Transport and Works Act 1992(a), hereby approves as from 30th March 2004, as a means by which specimens of breath may be provided for analysis under that section, each of the types of device set out in the Schedule hereto for the use of police forces in England, Wales and Scotland.

SCHEDULE

The device known as the **Camic Datamaster**, manufactured by **Camic** (Car and Medical Instrument Company) Ltd, composed of the Camic Datamaster, the Camic Gas System and software version 31-10-95.

The device known as the **Intoximeter EC/IR** manufactured by **Intoximeters Inc.** composed of the Intoximeter EC/IR, the Intoximeter EC/IR Gas Delivery System and software version EC/IR – UK 5.23.

The device known as the **Lion Intoxilyser 6000UK**, manufactured by **Lion Laboratories Limited**, composed of the Lion Intoxilyser 6000UK, the Lion Intoxilyser 6000UK Gas Delivery System Type A or Type C and software version 2.33.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Approval)

Section 31(1)(a) of the Transport and Works Act 1992 empowers a constable, in specified circumstances, to require a person to provide two specimens of breath for analysis by means of a device of a type approved by the Secretary of State. This approval approves as from 30 March 2004 for the purpose of analysing specimens of breath which may be provided for analysis under the said section 31(1)(a) the types of device set out in the Schedule.
