Publish government tourism strategy	We expect to publish the tourism strategy shortly. The Prime Minister announced on 5th January that the fund to create 50,000 jobs in tourism is on target to reach £100m, and our strategy will build on this announcement.
Announce findings of investigation into how to use cash in dormant betting accounts to set up a capital fund to improve local sports facilities and support sports clubs, and begin to implement	This has been delayed to allow coordination with other related announcements. We expect to announce our findings shortly.
