

DWP Public Bodies 2011

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1.0 Introduction

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) Public Bodies 2011 provides a summary of the arm's length bodies (ALBs) sponsored by the Department as at 31 March 2011 together with information on the staffing, funding and expenditure of these bodies at Annexes A and B.

It also provides details of the chairs and members appointed by Ministers to the boards of the ALBs between 1 April 2010 and 31 March 2011.

2.0 DWP Sponsored Bodies

As at 31 March 2011, the Department for Work and Pensions sponsored 14 ALBs: 4 Advisory Non-Departmental Public Bodies (NDPBs), 7 Executive NDPBs, 2 Tribunal NDPBs and 1 Public Corporation.

3.0 Annual Appointments Report

3.1 Changes during the year

The landscape of the Department's ALBs has changed over the 2010/11 year with the closure of two NDPBs – the Disability Employment Advisory Committee and the Personal Accounts Delivery Authority and the creation of a new body – the National Employment Savings Trust (NEST) Corporation.

3.2 Appointments

Between 1 April 2010 and 31 March 2011, there were thirty-two ministerial appointments, of which sixteen were new appointments and sixteen re-appointments/extensions. Subject to the individual meeting the current criteria for the post, reappointments take place only if the board member has performed satisfactorily during their current term of appointment. Performance appraisals are completed to establish if this is the case.

Annex C provides details of the ministerial appointments made between 1 April 2010 and 31 March 2011.

Annex D provides a diversity breakdown of the Department's Ministerial appointments.

3.3 Policy and Practice

Each ALB works to a senior responsible officer and has a sponsor or secretariat team, which is the link between the Department and the body itself.

The Department also has a central team within Information, Governance and Security (part of Professional Services) which is the focal point for issues relating to ALBs.

3.4 Appointment on Merit

In accordance with OCPA's Code of Practice, the Department is fully committed to the principle of appointment on merit. All candidates must be appointed on merit and regardless of gender, ethnic origin, marital status, sexual orientation, political affiliation, religion or disability. Decisions on merit are based on assessments of candidates against the role description and person specification for the advertised vacancy.

3.5 Encouraging Diversity

Since the period that this report covers, the Government has made clear its aspiration that by 2015, 50% of new public appointments will be held by women and it will be important to attract a strong and diverse field of candidates for each vacancy. Some of the Department's public bodies operate in very specialist fields, and the potential pool of candidates (particularly in pension, medical and scientific fields) can be quite small. However, to increase the female, disabled and ethnic

minority representation on the boards of its public bodies, the Department is committed to encouraging applications from all sections of society and those with non-traditional career paths and includes diversity statements within all vacancy advertisements. Stewardship teams are encouraged to scrutinise role and person specifications each time a vacancy occurs to ensure advertisements do not contain any unnecessary specific requirements which may limit the field of potential applicants and to take into account the balance of the board. In a recent audit of appointments conducted by OCPA, they acknowledged that the Department uses a number of different resources to advertise vacancies.

3.6 Monitoring Diversity

Diversity monitoring forms are issued together with application forms during recruitment exercises (but are not included in the sifting or interviewing process). This allows sponsor teams to evaluate the public appointments process by monitoring the gender, ethnicity and disability of candidates and identify the numbers of those applying and subsequently interviewed to ensure that there are no avoidable barriers to under-represented groups.

3.7 Public Appointments Vacancies Website

The Cabinet Office public appointments vacancies website (<http://publicappointments.cabinetoffice.gov.uk/>) is used to advertise all the department's public appointment vacancies. Advertisements aim to reflect the view that there should be no barriers to under-represented groups and that each board is committed to equality of opportunity. The Department for Work and Pensions also aims to promote awareness and ensure that as wide a range of potential applicants as possible are informed of vacancy opportunities.

3.8 Future Developments

Public Bodies Act

In June 2010, the Coalition Government launched a review of public bodies to look at reducing both the number of bodies across government and the cost to the taxpayer. All public bodies were considered in the review and in order to remain in existence, they needed to demonstrate that a public body was the most appropriate and cost-effective method of delivering the function. In addition, they also needed to satisfy at least one of three tests:

- that the body performs a technical function (which needs external expertise to deliver it);
- that the body delivers a function which needs to be, and be seen to be, delivered with absolute political impartiality (such as a regulatory or funding function); and
- is a body which delivers a function independently of Ministers to establish facts and/or figures with integrity.

The Public Bodies Bill received Royal Assent on 14 December 2011 and allows Ministers, by order, to abolish, merge or transfer the functions of the public bodies listed in the Act. In DWP this will result in the abolition of one advisory body (Disability Living Allowance Advisory Board), the abolition of one executive body (Child Maintenance and Enforcement Commission) whose function will be brought back into the Department to ensure Ministerial accountability, and the merger of two tribunal bodies (Pensions Ombudsman and Pension Protection Fund Ombudsman). Work will continue during 2012 and 2013 to bring about these changes.

Office of the Commissioner for Public Appointments Code of Practice

Sir David Normington was appointed as the Commissioner for Public Appointments in April 2011. In June 2011 he launched a consultation exercise to seek views on his proposals for changes to the regulatory regime for public appointments. Following this consultation, he has developed a principles-based Code, with a reformed compliance and audit process and revised reporting and transparency requirements. The new regulatory system came into effect from 1 April 2012. The Department's central public bodies team is working closely with the stewardship teams to design, deliver and agree with Ministers, a DWP public appointments process which meets the Commissioner's principles of merit, fairness and openness.
