

Amended guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003: Error Notice

The following note should be read in conjunction with the revised Guidance, issued by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport on 27 June 2013 and laid before each House of Parliament, under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Table: Recommended delegation of functions [at the end of chapter 13]

The listing 'Decision on whether a complaint is irrelevant frivolous vexatious etc' under the heading, 'Matters to be dealt with' should read, 'Decision on whether a *representation* is irrelevant frivolous vexatious etc'. The entry 'All cases' should move under the heading 'Officers'.

As is the case with most licensing functions, the licensing sub-committee (or the licensing committee itself) may exercise this function. The Licensing Act 2003 enables the committee to delegate functions to sub-committees or (in some cases) officers.
