RE: Freedom of Information Request

Thank you for your email of 25 July 2013 where you requested the information regarding how many working days have been lost in DECC, and among those we employ, as a result of industrial action since the 2010 general election and the cost to the public purse of covering for strike absence, or due to lost productivity, as a result of the industrial action. We have now completed searching for the information you requested.

- 1. The numbers of working days lost in DECC as a result of industrial action since the 2010 general election is 405. The Department does not have responsibility for any publicly funded agencies.
- 2. There has been no cost to the public purse in covering this strike action as staff were not required to work overtime nor were additional staff brought in to cover these strikes. The only way DECC is able to accurately quantify the level of lost productivity is through the number of working days lost stated in answer to part 1 of your question.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review.
