1. Reflections on the horsemeat incident

The view of some industry stakeholders is that the reaction of Government and the FSA wasn't very joined up. The requirement to test products for horse DNA in a very short space of time was asking a lot and, given that industry was testing already, was felt to be unnecessary by some people.

There was a communications failure in that testing was going on quite transparently yet the media were calling it a cover up.

The impact of horsemeat was on legitimate businesses but fraud was committed by criminals.

2. Strengths of current industry procedures for ensuring standards

The industry can pat itself on the back in terms of the processes that already take place for ensuring standards are met.

3. Possible improvements to current procedures – intelligence, horizon scanning

A view the FWD would have some sympathy with is that all that is needed to strengthen supply chain integrity is another HACCP for authenticity.

There is a failure in process at the moment about how intelligence is shared. There's a lot of mistrust between the industry and Government which you're never going to solve. Food businesses are fierce competitors - they will make capital out of each other's problems.

There is a job to do for industry and government to better share intelligence and engage in more horizon scanning.
