This revised information note has been issued by the Department for Communities and Local Government Council Tax Policy team. Following the issuance of the previous circular on 31 October 2013, an error was discovered on the part of the Department of Communities and Local Government in the published figures on Localised Council Tax Support Administration Subsidy Funding. This error has been corrected and revised Localised Council Tax Support Administration Subsidy Funding figures are contained within this note. The error also impacted on the calculation of Housing Benefit Administration Subsidy by the Department of Work and Pensions. The Department of Work and Pensions have published revised Housing Benefit Administration Subsidy figures.

**Allocation of 2014/15 Localised Council Tax Support
Administration Subsidy to Local Authorities in
England**

This sets out the distribution of subsidy paid to local authorities in England for administering Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) in 2014/15. The distribution is based on 2012/13 Local Authorities (LAs) council tax benefit caseload data split by pensioner and working age claimants, taking account of labour and accommodation costs.

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Background

1. Following the abolition of Council Tax Benefit (CTB) and the introduction of Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) in April 2013, the funding baseline for Housing Benefit (HB)/ Council Tax Benefit (CTB) will be disaggregated from 2014/15 onwards. The Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) will be responsible for allocating the Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) element to English local authorities (LAs), while the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) will be responsible for allocating the Housing Benefit (HB) element.
2. Negotiations with Her Majesty's Treasury (HMT) at Spending Review (SR) 2013 concluded that, for 2014/15, 80% of the total Housing Benefit (HB) and Local Council Tax Support (LCTS) administration grant will reside with the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), with the remaining 20% being included in the Department for Communities and Local Government's (DCLG's) and the Devolved Administrations' baselines to meet part of the costs of Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS). The Department for Communities and Local Government's share of this total is £73.90m
3. Discussions between the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) officials and the Council Tax Partnership Forum about allocating 2014/15 Local Council Tax Support (LCTS) funding concluded that both Local Council Tax Support (LCTS) and Housing Benefit (HB) funding should be considered together and compared to total funding for 2013/14. This was deemed necessary in order to negate any unintended consequences of the policy decision to disaggregate Housing Benefit (HB) / Council Tax Benefit (CTB) and avoid any Local Authorities (LAs) suffering wide variations in funding between 2013/14 and 2014/15.
4. The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has issued a circular (HB S9/2013) regarding 2014/15 Housing Benefit (HB) funding detailing individual Local Authorities (LA) allocations.

Distribution methodology

5. We will allocate each Local Authority (LA) a share of the total administration subsidy funding for Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) that reflects its share of the national Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) work done.
6. As Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) caseload data is not yet available, the most recent Council Tax Benefit (CTB) caseload data split by pensioner and working age claimant will be used in its place.

7. The methodology uses weightings to reflect the differences in administration costs between pensioner and working age claimants. Although there is no difference in weighting applied to caseload data between the two groups in 2014/15, the methodology allows for appropriate levels of factors to be applied in the future as Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) schemes develop.

Labour cost adjustments

8. For labour costs, the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) Labour Cost Adjustment (LCA) ratios will be applied. *Table 1* shows a summary of the values to be used.

Accommodation factors

9. For accommodation factors, the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) Rates Cost Adjustment (RCA) ratios will be applied. *Table 2* below shows a summary of the values to be used.

The formula

10. The subsidy is distributed among Local Authorities (LAs) by taking Council Tax Benefit (CTB) caseloads into account and applying adjustments to compensate for variations in accommodation and labour costs between regions.
11. The Local Council Tax Support (LCTS) administration subsidy for a particular Local Authority (LA) is equal to a fraction of the total administration subsidy. This fraction is calculated using the Adjusted Caseloads and the labour and accommodation indices

$$\text{Factor} = \text{Adjusted Caseload} \times [0.25 + 0.65 \times \text{Labour indices} + 0.1 \times \text{Accommodation indices}]$$

$$\text{Admin Subsidy} = \text{Factor} \times \text{Total Admin Subsidy} / \text{Sum of factors for all LAs}$$

12. The Adjusted Caseloads are calculated by applying the relevant weighting to pensioner and working age claimant caseload and summing the total. As stated previously, there is no difference in weighting applied to caseload data between the two groups in 2014/15.

13. The proposed methodology would not be suitable for calculating Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) administration funding for the Isles of Scilly (IoS) as there is no caseload data available. Therefore, a unique approach has been taken in this one instance. The total administration funding distributed to the IoS in 2013/14 has been reduced by 10% to reflect the 10% efficiency reduction in 2014/15 announced at the Spending Round this year. 20% of this figure has then been chosen to be distributed by the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) as Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) administration funding to reflect the 20% share of total Housing Benefit (HB) and Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS) funding allocated to the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) in 2014/15.
