You also asked for these statistics for the remainder of 2012 calendar year; this information is a subset of an official statistic <u>DRT0101</u> which is not due to be published until 28 February. The information you have requested could be used to calculate an official statistic's figure. Official statistics are exempt from release under section 44 (1)(a) (prohibitions on disclosure) by virtue of the Pre-release Access to Official Statistics Order 2008 which limits access to official statistics until their date of publication. As this exemption is an absolute exemption we are not required to conduct a public interest test. A copy of this exemption in full can be found at Annex B. This information is due to be published on 7 March at the link provided above.
