

Hazardous waste - example Part A consignment note for rejected loads

Part A	
A1	Consignment note code
	<p>If the original consignment note code was correct:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • copy it <p>and</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • add an 'R' at the end (so nnnnnn/nnnnnR)
	<p>If there was no consignment note or the original code was wrong, the consignee will issue the carrier with a rejection document with a code for the rejected load in the format REJECT/XXXYY where:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • XXX is any three letters or numbers used to identify the producer or holder's business name • YY is any two letters or numbers used to give the load a unique code <p>You then</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • copy it, and • add an 'R' at the end (so REJECT/XXXYYR)
A2	The waste described below is to be removed from (name, address, postcode, telephone, email, facsimile):
	The details of the original producer or holder provided on Part A2 of the rejected consignment note (not the details of the site that rejected the waste).
A3	Premises code
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • if there was no original consignment note use 'REJECT' • otherwise use the registration number of the original producer, or 'N/A' if the site is exempt.
A4	The waste will be taken to (name, address and postcode):
	The address of the new consignee where the waste is next moving to.
A5	The waste producer was (if different from 2) (name, address, postcode, telephone, email, facsimile):
	The details of the original producer or holder provided on Part A5 of the rejected consignment note.
