Important notes on eligibility

<p>Can I apply?</p>	<p>To apply you must be 18 years old or over when your visa lets you come to the United Kingdom (becomes valid) and under 31 years old when you apply. You cannot apply if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You have children under 18 years old who are either living with you, or you are financially responsible for; or You have been in the United Kingdom at any other time as a working holidaymaker or under the youth mobility scheme.

<p>Completed visa application form: In some locations you can only apply by making an online application. You should check on our supported countries page to see if you should make an online application</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your country does not support online applications you must complete and submit application form VAF9 If you make an online application you must also print it off and submit with your supporting documents
<p>A current and valid travel document or passport</p>	<p>You will not be issued a visa if you do not have one of these</p>
<p>One passport-sized colour photograph</p>	<p>This must comply with the requirements in our photo guidance</p>
<p>Evidence of your permission to be in the country where you are applying, if you are not a national of that country</p>	<p>This must show your current immigration status. It could be a residence permit, 'green card' or valid visa.</p>
<p>Previous passports</p>	<p>These are to show your previous travel history</p>
<p>Translations: The original translation must contain confirmation of the following from the translator:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> That it is an accurate translation of the original document The date of the translation The translators full name and signature The translators contact details

Sponsor

<p>If you are a national of one of the countries in the scheme, you may be able to come to the UK under the Youth Mobility Scheme.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Australia • Canada • Japan • Hong Kong • Monaco • New Zealand • Republic of Korea • Taiwan <p>Your national government will be your sponsor. You do not need to send any evidence of sponsorship, just your passport, issued by a country participating in the scheme.</p>
<p>British overseas citizens, British overseas territories citizens and British nationals (overseas).</p>	<p>British overseas citizens, British overseas territories citizens and British nationals (overseas) can also apply under the scheme, and do not need a sponsor.</p>
<p>Certificate of sponsorship</p>	<p>If you want to apply as the holder of a Taiwanese passport, you must provide a certificate of sponsorship from Taiwan's National Youth Commission.</p> <p>If you want to apply as the holder of a Hong Kong Administrative Region passport, you must provide a certificate of sponsorship from the Hong Kong Labour Department.</p> <p>If you want to apply as the holder of a Republic of Korea passport, you must provide a certificate of sponsorship from the Republic of Korea Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</p>

Maintenance in the UK

<p>Personal Bank Statements and /or a Savings Account pass book(s) and / or a letter from bank confirming level of funds on the bank's original letter headed paper.</p>	<p>These must be dated no more than one month before you apply. The amount is assessed on the exchange rate of the date you pay your fee. We use the OANDA website to assess the exchange rate.</p> <p>The closing balance must show that you have at least £1,800 (or £1890 if applying on or after 1 July 2014) in your account. Evidence must be in the form of cash funds. Other accounts or financial instruments for example, shares, bonds and pension funds, regardless of notice are not acceptable.</p> <p>If you wish to rely on a joint account as evidence of available funds, you must be named on the account along with one or more other named individual.</p>
<p>Letter from financial institution regulated by either the Financial Conduct Authority or the home regulator confirming funds.</p>	<p>The letter should state your name; the account number; the date of the letter; the financial institution's name and logo; confirmation that there are sufficient funds present in the account (the balance must be at least £1,800 or £1890 if applying on or after 1 July 2014).</p> <p>The home regulator is the official regulatory body for the country in which the institution operates and the funds are located.</p>
