Negotiations with the European Commission on the draft Operational Programme will start shortly. We will update you on progress towards the agreement of a finalised Operational Programme and its formal adoption by the Commission in due course.

Events to boost exports from Leeds City Region

A programme of events to help businesses which are new to exporting trade overseas is scheduled to take place in the Leeds City Region. With co-financing support from ESF and the Skills Funding Agency, this is a Skills Support for the Workforce contract managed by Leeds City College and involving specialist international trade body Chamber International. Novice exporters will be able to attend themed networking

events and receive practical help and advice from experienced exporters free of charge. The events will be held at business premises in the region, including in Bradford, Calderdale, Craven, Harrogate, Kirklees, Leeds, Selby, Wakefield and York.

Low season training to support tourism businesses in Devon

North Devon+ and the Northern Devon Employment & Skills Board (ESB) have secured funding from the European Social Fund to offer free in-work development of customer service skills for 20 eligible businesses. This training is worth up to £1,250 and will take place in the low season to enable seasonal workers or tourism-related businesses to take part.

Can Do beach clean is raising aspirations



More than 30 adult learners and their children took part in a Community Beach Clean on August 14th as part of an innovative course to help Cornish residents find out how they can access higher education whilst gaining an accredited qualification in a specific subject area. Can Do offers courses in Community Development, Studio Arts, Health and Social Care or Science and the Environment – all developed to reflect higher education opportunities and priority areas for the Cornish economy. More than 30 adults are now on the course and progressing through a

Level Two qualification. Can Do is delivered by CN4C as part of the Combined Universities in Cornwall Raising Aspirations Programme (RAP), which receives ESF Convergence investment. RAP aims to increase adult participation in higher education and raise skills levels across Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.
