

A table is attached showing the works of art provided in Ministers' offices in this Department since 12 May 2010. They are all provided from the Government Art Collection and the information is correct as of 26 August 2010. None of the works of art is newly purchased or commissioned specifically for any Ministers as the art is chosen from existing acquisitions in the Collection.

Up to date valuations of the works of art have not been provided in this answer. Against a background of constant and volatile fluctuations in the art market, current valuations of every work of art in the Collection are not maintained.

There have been no items of art, as described above, that have been moved into any of the offices occupied by the Department's Special Advisers.

The only clocks that are provided in the rooms occupied by Ministers and Special Advisers are standard plastic office clocks. These have been in the offices for several years and would be of minimal value.
