



## A Who can apply?

You can only get a duplicate tax disc if:

You are the registered keeper of the vehicle and have a Registration Certificate (V5C) in your name.

If you have recently bought the vehicle you will need to have a V5C in your name to be able to get a duplicate tax disc.

## B How and where do you apply

You should fill in this form and take it with your V5C and the fee of £7 (if applicable, see note C) to your nearest Post Office® branch that issues duplicate tax discs.

## C How much will it cost?

The fee for a duplicate tax disc is £7 however there is no fee if:

- no fee was payable for the original disc
- the tax disc has been lost in the post when it was sent to you by DVLA
- the tax disc has been damaged or the details have faded and cannot be read when you received it from DVLA or the Post Office® (in either case you must return it with this application form)
- the original tax disc is being held by the police as evidence
- the vehicle is stolen and recovered but the tax disc is missing, or
- DVLA rejected your application for a refund of vehicle tax when it was sent in with the tax disc.

## D How to pay

You can use a debit card, cash, cheque or postal order, payable to Post Office Ltd.

## E Data protection – releasing information
