Users and their Uses

The Indices of Deprivation are exploited by a wide range of users in a variety of ways:

User	Uses
Government Departments	Distribution of funding or as part of a funding formula for programmes; assessing inequalities, policy analysis
Local Government and health services	Targeting funding or interventions, setting strategies, needs assessments, prioritising resources, evidence for funding bids, tracking deprived areas over time
Academia / Research Community	Analysis, research, modelling
Private sector	Identification of customers in deprived areas eligible for provisions
Voluntary and Community Sector	Evidence for funding bids; identification of need for for intervention
Citizens	Completing funding applications

Main Channels for User Engagement

Public consultations - a formal consultation was launched on 13 November 2014 seeking views on the final proposals for updating the English Indices of Deprivation 2010 and inviting views on dissemination and outputs.

User Events – User Events to learn about the final proposals for updating the Indices took place during November 2014. A session on the Indices was held as part of DCLG's Statistics User Engagement Day in November 2013.

User Surveys – a User Survey took place in July 2014 inviting ideas for updating and strengthening the Indices.

Advisory Group – the Advisory Group for the Indices update includes representatives from central and local government and other interest groups, including the voluntary and community sector.
