BRECON BEACONS RIFLE RANGE.

BYE-LAWS

Made by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, with the consent of the Brecknock Rural District Council, under the provisions of the Military Lands Acts, 1892 to 1900.

1 The area of land affected by these Bye-laws (hereinafter called "the danger area") lies about 4 miles South West of Brecon and about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile East of the summit of Pen Milan. Its length, which runs due North and South, is about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile; its width at the Northern or firing end is about 300 yards and increases to 500 yards at the Southern end.

2. The danger area is defined by six poles, three of which are placed on the Eastern boundary and three on the Western boundary, all painted black and white. In addition notice boards are placed where any pathway enters the danger area.

3. During such time as firing is taking place the danger area will be closed to the public, and notice that the area is closed will be given by hoisting a red flag on the flagstaff erected on the high ground to the South of the danger area.

4. When and during the time the flag is hoisted on the point mentioned in No. 3, no person shall enter the danger area, and no vehicle, animal or thing will be allowed to remain in the danger area, and all public roads and footpaths thereon will be closed.

5. The Officer in charge of the said danger area, and the Officer in charge of the troops at Brecon, or any Officer, Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer, or the Military Police for the time being under the command of any such officer as aforesaid, or any constable, shall have power and is hereby authorised:—

- (1) To remove from the danger area and take into custody without warrant, and bring before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, as mentioned in the said Military Lands Acts, to be dealt with according to law, any person contravening these Bye-laws.
- (2) To remove from the danger area any vehicle, animal, or thing found thereon in contravention of any of these Bye-laws, and any such vehicle, animal, or thing shall be liable to forfeiture, as mentioned in the said Military Lands Acts.

6. Any person contravening any of these Bye-laws shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same, and is, under the same Acts, liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding Five Pounds.
