<b>Description</b>	A unique identifier for a court as part of the judicial structure. The published list of values also includes quasi- and non-court bodies whose decisions are recorded in the same or similar manner as a court case outcome.

<b>Minimum</b>	4
<b>Maximum</b>	4

<b>Validation</b>	Numeric - a leading zero is required for values below 1000.

<b>Comments</b>	<p>This code structure is concerned with judicial structure; it does not refer to a physical location such as a court building.</p> <p>Examples of a National Court Code are:</p> <p><b>1972 Norfolk Magistrates Court</b> (refers to the Local Justice Area (LJA) of Norfolk. Magistrates from this bench may habitually sit in any one of a number of physical court houses (e.g. Norwich, Kings Lynn, Great Yarmouth)).</p> <p><b>9983 VOSA</b> (refers to the Vehicle Operations Safety Agency in its capacity as a fixed penalty issuer).</p>
