Natural England has now decided how to proceed following its review of the above mentioned direction to restrict CROW Access rights on this land. A second consultation has been held between 19th January and 13th February with statutory consultees and the general public. We received feedback from the Ramblers Association who commented that accepted some form of restriction is required and that if there was no change in land use and activities on the site the last review then a similar direction would be required.

Outcome of the review:

Natural England's decision is to vary the end date of the direction to allow the restriction to continue.

It is necessary to restrict CROW access to this extent to prevent danger to the public from motorsports taking place on the site.

Relevant Authority Guidance (Criteria set 21) assesses the need to restrict access for a variety of recreational activities. It indicates that whilst visitors exercising CROW access rights will usually take account of how other people are using access land, there are occasions when informal recreation will need to be separated from dangerous activities such as motor sports (particularly in woodland or environments where it is less easy to see vehicles etc. approaching).

The nature of the terrain on the TRAX site and the habitat which creates poor sight lines, and also the type of sport that occurs (karting, motocross, scrambling) mean a restriction is necessary in this instance.

There is also potential for walkers to cause disruption to the activities, with riders having to stop and take additional precautions if visitors are seen within the racing area.

Additional routes through the site were considered but were impractical due to fencing and security gates.

An exclusion from the areas where motorsport activity is permitted is the lowest level of restriction required.

Natural England's policy for long term directions is that they should not be given for a period of more than 6 years. Therefore the original direction will be varied to have an end date of 13/2/2021.

Where a direction restricts access indefinitely, for more than five years, for part of every year, or for part of at least six consecutive years, we have a statutory duty to review it within five years of the date of its issue.
