


Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing Sector


Crime against this sector is similar to 2013:

- This sector experienced the least crime compared to all CVS sectors surveyed in 2012, 2013 and 2014.
- Crime and victimisation rates for most crime types are smaller than in 2013, but most falls are not statistically significant.
- The proportion of premises that experienced metal theft fell by three percentage points between 2013 and 2014.


Theft and vandalism were the most common crime types in 2013 and 2014:
