## **OPHTHALMIC MEDICAL PRACTITIONER**

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

**Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners** are qualified doctors who are employed to work in the premises of an Optometrist to carry out medical eye examinations and prescribe glasses (For further information about Optometrists please see the Optometrist occupation sheet).

Ophthalmologists / Consultant Ophthalmologists are qualified doctors.

Ophthalmology is the medical and surgical management of conditions relating to the eye and its surrounding areas. The speciality covers all age ranges

#### INDUSTRY REQUIREMENTS

Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners- must be medically trained doctors who are also required to hold a higher diploma, membership and of fellowship in Ophthalmology from the Royal College of Ophthalmologists of equivalent qualifications as approved by the Ophthalmic Qualification Committee. They must also have held appointments for at least two years as an Ophthalmologist in a National Health Service hespital.

Ophthalmologist / Consultant Ophthalmologist To become a Consultant Ophthalmologist in the UK applicants must be medically trained doctors, who have completed their specialist training with the Royal College of Ophthalmologists and gained their Certificate of Completion of Specialist Training (CCST) in Ophthalmology and gained specialist registration with the General Medical Council (GMC)

## REGISTRATION WITH A PROFESSIONAL BODY

Ophthalm is ledical Practitioners and Ophthalmologists are qualified doctors. Therefore to undertake any direct patient care in the UK they are legally required to register with the GMC. Caseworkers of registration, Full, Provisional, Limited and Specialist. Caseworkers should note that when doctors are classed as Consultant level or above they must have Specialist registration. For further information relating to how overseas applicants can gain specialist registration see spendix 2.

Professional List of Medical Practitioners must also register on the Central Professional List of Medical Practitioners. To register they must have their cases reviewed by the Ophthalmic Qualifications Committee. This is

connected with The British Medical Association (BMA). Caseworkers should note that the Central Professional List of Medical Practitioners is completely separate to BMA registration. BMA registration is not a legal requirement of being an Ophthalmic Medical Practitioner. #### **CASEWORKER TREATMENT**

Caseworkers should be aware that Consultants in Ophthalmology are shortage occupation and advertising is not required.

## Skills criteria

Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners, Ophthalmologists and Consultant Ophthalmologists all meet the skills criteria.

### Registration

Doctors training to become Ophthalmic Medical Practioners or Consultant Ophthalmologists need to have the opropiate GMC registration. Caseworkers should cheat the GMC registration number against the register. Where caseworkers have doubt whether the doctor's GMC registration is current, they may request a copy of the doctor's Annual Retention Certificate (ARC).

In cases where the doctor has not yet received the ARC, conditional approval may be granted using paragraph P70H with the proviso that they obtain registration before starting work. Case workers should request the doctor's letter of invitation to the interview from the GMC in such circumstances.

**Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners** need to have the appropriate GMC registration and be on the Central Professional List of Medical Practitioners. Caseworkers should check the GMC registration number against the GMC register and phone or e-mail the Ophthalmic Qualifications Committee.

Consultant level and above Ophthalmologists need to have Specialist registration caseworkers should check the GMC registration number against the register.

## **TWÉS**

#### Training

This occupation is unsuitable for training.

## **Work Experience**

This occupation may be suitable for work experience, if the applicant has the appropriate GMC registration. Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners must also be on the Central Professional List of Medical Practitioners.

## TWES MTI

It is possible that some overseas qualified Ophthalmologists will be offered training by the Royal College of Ophthalmologists. Applications for such posts may be approved under the MTI category.

#### **SALARY**

The salary rate for Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners 2007/2008 depends on the stage of the Ophthalmic Medical Practitioner or Doctor's career Please see the Agenda for Change salary rates below. All NHS salares are based on a 37 ½ hour week.

## **Appendix 1**

# Modernising Medical Careers - NHS changes from August 2007

The new NHS career framework is being rolled out at the present time. It will be implemented for Specialist Level Training in August 2007; this will replace the current training requirements to work as an Ophthalmologist. In the future Ophthalmic Medical Practitioners will gain a Certificate of Completion Training (CTT) from the Post Graduate Medical Education and Training Board (PMETB). Gaining CCT will allow Ophthalmologists to enter the specialist register held by the GMC. Ophthalmologists who have gained the relevant training and experience overseas may still be able to register with the specialist register held by the GMC without completing the CCT. These applications will be assessed on a case by case basis by the PMETB.

## Appendix 2

# The Royal College of Ophthalmologists - pathways to the specialist register for overseas qualified specialists

If the Ophthalmologist has completed their ophthalmic training and holds specialist qualifications awarded outside the UK specialist register. They will be required to satisfy the Specialist Training Authority (STA) that their training and qualifications are equivalent to a UK Certificate of Completion of Specialist Training (CCST) in ophthalmology. A CCST marks the end point of defined UK specialist training programmes. Where an overseas national has an overseas qualification in which there is no CCST speciality the overseas national will be required to satisfy the STA that they have a level of knowledge and skill consistent with practice as an Ophthalmic Medical Consultant in the UK.
