

## RADIOGRAPHER/ULTRASONOGRAPHER

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

There are two sorts of Radiographer: **Diagnostic** and **Therapeutic**.

**Diagnostic Radiographers:** employ a range of sophisticated equipment to produce high quality images to diagnose an injury or disease. They use a range of techniques including:

- X-Rays
- Ultrasound
- Fluoroscopy
- CT (Computed Tomography)
- MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging)
- Angiography

**Therapeutic Radiographers:** are responsible for the treatment of patients, mostly those with cancer, using ionising radiation. They are responsible for the accurate planning and delivery of a prescribed dose of radiation to specific areas of the body and wider aspects of oncology. Workers also provide information, support and counselling to patients undergoing radiotherapy treatment.

All Radiographers work to a set of Statements for Professional Conduct which sets out the underpinning values and principles to promote maintain and disseminate the highest standards of behaviour in order to enhance the good standing and reputation of the radiography profession.

An Ultrasonographer is a recognised specialism within the diagnostic radiographer field. They specialise in Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI), Breast Screening, CT Scanning, nuclear medicine and medical ultrasound.

### INDUSTRY REQUIREMENTS

To order to work as a Radiographer in the UK, the minimum requirement is a BSc (Hons) degree in Radiography that has been approved by The Health Professions Council (HPC).

It is important to note that Diagnostic Radiographers and Therapeutic Radiographers have different training and professional qualifications. Diagnostic Radiographers must have a degree in Diagnostic Radiography, while Therapeutic Radiographers need a degree in Radiotherapy.

To specialise as a Sonographer or Ultrasonographer, a candidate will usually need to qualify in Radiography and then complete a one-year post-registration course, that is approved by the Consortium for Accreditation of Sonographic Education (CASE).

### REGISTRATION WITH A PROFESSIONAL BODY

To use the title Radiographer, Diagnostic Radiographer and Therapeutic Radiographer a candidate must be registered with the HPC.

Overseas qualified workers need to apply to the HPC's International Registration Department, who assess the workers on education, training, and experience to determine if these are comparable to the HPC standards of proficiency for Radiographers. If they are found to be comparable, registration will be granted. There is no adaptation training available for overseas trained Radiographers.

## **CASEWORKER TREATMENT**

### **B&C**

The job meets the skills criteria when the post requires the candidate to be registered with the HPC. Workers with an approved qualification who have yet to be awarded HPC registration can be approved conditionally, adapting paragraph P70H in the approval letter.

Ultrasonographer is now recognised as a shortage specialism, along with all radiography occupations.

### **TWES**

#### **Training**

This occupation is unsuitable for training.

#### **Work Experience**

This occupation is suitable for work experience, if the worker is HPC registered.
