Pilot Phase Highlights

The pilot phase of SIDC ended in June. A successful year saw SIDC secure £312,000 of investment in innovation for the Communications Capabilities Development Programme (CCD).

A series of **events on body worn video**, bringing end users together with manufacturers, resulted in **81% of suppliers** stating that they would incorporate the information received from these events in their product development.



A demonstration of the digitally enabled police officer of the future - was shown at events including the SIDC launch and the Security and Policing Exhibition. It provided visitors from the UK and overseas an insight into the strength of the UK security market, as well as how SIDC can help to bring about transformational change. It also featured on the BBC News Website.

SIDC Future

July saw the first meeting of the Security and Resilience Growth Partnership (SRGP), chaired by the Rt Hon John Hayes MP, the new Security Minister. The Minister reiterated the government's commitment to the SRGP and the role of SIDC. Increasing exports is a government priority and the meeting discussed how the SRGP could help deliver this.

"Our aim is to help make the UK a global leader in security and resilience technology by making it easier for partnerships between industry, academia and users to quickly develop and demonstrate innovative solutions."

The SIDC and SRGP objective of promoting innovation and growth, links closely to the government's Strategic Defence and Security Review (SDSR), the cross government, Cabinet Office led strategic approach government is taking to national security. Started in 2010, the SDSR is due an update this year.
