## 2. Nuclear Institute – Alan Ruiz, Amec

The institute was created in 2009 from the merger of the British Nuclear Energy Society and the Institution of Nuclear Engineers, it is not a trade organisation and focus is on education and training on technical issues. The Institute covers all areas of the Nuclear Industry, civil new build and decommissioning and Defence. The institute is run by volunteers and includes an active younger member group for those under 37yrs! Collaboration with other Institutes such as Mechanical and Chemical Engineering is encouraged.

## 5. NDA Update

NDA SME Action plan has been revised and approved by Baroness Verma, DECC and has been sent to for final approval by Francis Maude, Minister for the Cabinet Office.

NDA target SME Spend is 20% and achieved 19% in the past year on both Direct and Indirect spend.

Each SLC has their own SME Action Plan that should be published on their respective websites. Current projects being run by the NDA are the NDA SME Mentor Scheme with over 40 Mentors and Mentees registered and working together. The forthcoming NDA Supply Chain Event will be held at Event City on 6<sup>th</sup> November with up to 1500 delegates expected. UKTI will also be holding workshops on 7<sup>th</sup> November and have visitors expected from Japan, China and Europe. A map of SME's in the Nuclear Decomm industry has been produced by Sam Dancy based on data provided by Dun & Bradstreet and is being validated by the SLC's for accuracy.

The next National SME SG meeting will be held in October where issues of a more national nature are raised. Previous successes include changes to Payment Terms, Insurance briefing note, IP Policy etc. Guest speaker will be Jean Llewellyn from NSAN.

### 6. Introduction to NSC2 – Andrew Vincent, Scottish Enterprise

Nuclear Supply Chain 2 (NSC2) is a second initiative by the SE to support companies either in or wanting to proceed in the Nuclear Industry. Funding has now been approved and will follow a similar format to the previous program with Workshops, 1 to 1 support, Technical and Business initiatives with an emphasis on problem and solution innovation. Plan is to support up to 70 companies. SE are going through the OJEU process at the time, more details will follow once a supplier is selected. SE are also interested in hearing from any SME's who would be interested in helping with the development of the new initiative.

From this presentation discussion grew into how to ensure companies know about the availability of support and where to find information for new companies entering the Nuclear Decommissioning industry.

## 8. Fit 4 Nuclear

Currently funded by the Regional Development agencies growth funds and was not available to companies based in Scotland, however S.E. are planning on providing the same level of funding for Scottish companies to be able to enter into the next phase of the scheme. Changes are being made the revised F4N programme to include greater emphasis on the Decommissioning sector & R & D funding.
