

SIDC Update # 4 - November 2015



SIDC Highlights

FUTURE BORDERS EXPERIENCE

SIDC has been working with the event organisers <u>Nineteen Events</u> and a number of UK companies to create a Future Borders Experience at the <u>Transport Security Expo</u>, Olympia on 2-3 December 2015. The experience is an immersive demonstrator in which passengers will experience what the future border may look like.



A combination of stand-off detection technologies, together with other intelligence will produce a passenger risk level profile, which changes as they move through the demonstrator. The aim is to help smooth the experience of border crossing for legitimate purposes.

The demonstrator will be accompanied by a series of lectures delivered by the companies involved as well as government officials, discussing the challenges raised by the Future Borders Experience.

SECURITY & POLICING 2016

SIDC are delighted to announce that the lead integrator for the <u>Security & Policing 2016</u> demonstrator will be <u>BAE Systems Applied Intelligence</u>.

The Security & Policing 2016 demonstrator has the working title "Frontline. Online. Everywhere" and will illustrate how current and future online and digital capabilities can be used and integrated to create a mobile investigative capability for law enforcement and border security. The SIDC team are looking forward to working with BAE Systems Applied Intelligence to finalise details, working with UK law enforcement and border agencies to ensure maximum benefits are realised.

FAST PARCEL INNOVATIVE CALL

Following a briefing event on the government's key priorities for security in the fast parcel industry on 5 October, applications for funding were invited from interested parties. These applications are now being considered and a decision on who will be receiving up to £30k for three month's work will be announced shortly. A second phase of funding will follow on next year. SIDC's EYE ON INNOVATION

With a completely new approach to locations labelling, <u>WHAT 3 WORDS</u> could revolutionise the way emergency services, including the police, find locations. By simply dividing the world into 57 trillion 3x3 metre squares, and giving each one a unique combination of three words, the system provides a designation that's easier to communicate than GPS co-ordinates and more precise than post codes. With such a small grid, it is possible to denote individual doors, not just properties.

It may not be long before you call the police and ask them to attend 'poem.waddle.twig' instead of SW1P 4DF.
