

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981 SECTION 53

Doncaster Metropolitan Borough Council
Public Footpath No.16 Doncaster Definitive Map Modification Order 2014

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **26 January 2016**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a hearing.

The Hearing will be held at **The Council Chamber, Doncaster Council, Civic Offices, Waterdale, Doncaster, DN1 3BU** on **Tuesday 7 June 2016** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding to then the footpath described in the following schedule.

SCHEDULE

Description of footpath to be added

Public Footpath commencing at its junction with Oswin Avenue, at grid reference SE5608 0139 and proceeding in a north east direction for 130 metres ending at its junction with Furnival Road at grid reference SE5618 0148. Widths: The width of the footpath is 3 metres.

Timetable for sending in statements of case

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 22 March 2016]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices) to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order.

Within 12 weeks of the start date [by 19 April 2016]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Hearing must ensure their statement of case¹ is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies to the Authority, the applicant, every person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has written to us in respect of the Order (excluding copies of any supporting documents, although these will be available to view at the Authority's offices).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.

We cannot accept any libellous, racist or abusive comments. Any documents containing such comments will be returned.
